
BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte,

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ORDINANCE NO. 762-X

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 520-X, THE 1972-73 BUDGET ORDINANCE, ESTABLISHING A BUDGET FOR THE EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte,
North Carolina;

Section 1. That Section 2, Schedule A (General Fund Revenues) is hereby amended to increase Intergovernmental Revenue by \$20,085, the federal portion of funds used to administer the Equal Employment Opportunity Program.

Section 2. That \$6,723 is hereby transferred from Account 530.79 (Supervisory Training Program) to Account 115.04 (Equal Employment Opportunity Program) for the City's cash match for the program.

Section 3. That Section 1, Schedule A (General Fund Expenditures) is hereby amended to add appropriations for the following project:

ORDINANCE NO. 763-X

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING THE DWELLING AT 623-627 Jackson Avenue
TO BE VACATED, DEMOLISHED AND REMOVED PURSUANT TO THE HOUSING CODE OF THE
CITY OF CHARLOTTE AND ARTICLE 19, CHAPTER 160A OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF
NORTH CAROLINA, SAID BUILDING BEING THE PROPERTY OF Bernard L. Abrams & Wife
RESIDING AT 2240 Roswell Avenue, Charlotte, N. C.

WHEREAS, the dwelling located at 623-627 Jackson Avenue
in the City of Charlotte has been found by the Superintendent of Building
Inspection to be unfit for human habitation and the owners thereof have
been ordered to vacate and demolish said dwelling pursuant to the Housing
Code of the City of Charlotte and Article 19, Chapter 160A of the General
Statutes of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the owners thereof have been ordered to demolish and remove
said dwelling, pursuant to the Housing Code of the City of Charlotte and
Article 19, Chapter 160A of the General Statutes of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, said owners have failed to comply with the said orders
to vacate and demolish said dwelling and to remove said dwelling, which
orders were served by registered mail on the 9-18-72
and 10-4-72.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of
Charlotte, that the Superintendent of Building Inspection is hereby
ordered to cause the dwelling located at 623-627 Jackson Avenue
in the City of Charlotte to be vacated, and to be demolished and removed,
all in accordance with the Housing Code of the City of Charlotte and
Article 19, Chapter 160A of the General Statutes of North Carolina.
