Amending Chapter 4
Article 1, Section 4-2

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 4, ARTICLE I, SECTION 4-2, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE WITH RESPECT TO AIRCRAFT ALTITUDE LIMITATION.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina:

Section 1. Chapter 4, Article I, Section 4-2 of the Code of the City of Charlotte is hereby amended by adding to said section the following:

"Provided further, that aeronauts or pilots operating aircraft or helicopters owned by or under the direction of agencies and departments of the City of Charlotte shall be exempt from the provisions of this section."

Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.



ORDINANCE 971

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 19, ARTICLE II, SECTION 19-86.1
AMENDING THE RATES AND CHARGES FOR AMBULANCES IN THE CITY
OF CHARLOTTE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 19, Article II, Section 19-86.1 sets forth the rates and charges for ambulance service rendered by persons owning, operating and controlling ambulances under a certificate of public convenience and necessity; and

WHEREAS, Ambulance Service of Charlotte, Inc. has requested that the City Council amend Chapter 19, Article II, Section 19-86.1 to provide for changes in the schedule of rates and charges to assure the maintenance of prompt, adequate and efficient ambulance service for the citizens of the City of Charlotte; and

WHEREAS, the Charlotte Ambulance Service Advisory Board, authorized by the City Council and appointed by the Mayor to study the needs of the Charlotte Ambulance Service, has also recommended changes in the schedule of rates and charges for ambulance service in its report of November 24, 1970.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina:

Section 1. That Chapter 19, Article II, Section 19-86.1, Rates and charges, of the Code of the City of Charlotte is hereby amended by changing the rates set forth therein as follows:

1. Subsection 19-86.1 (1) (a) is amended by deleting the figure "\$20.00" and inserting in lieu thereof the figure "\$25.00".


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2. Subsection 19-86.1 (1) (b) is amended by deleting the figure "\$0.75" and inserting in lieu thereof the figure "\$1.00".
3. Subsection 19-86.1 (2) (a) is amended by deleting the figure "\$20.00" and inserting in lieu thereof the figure "\$25.00".
4. Subsection 19-86.1 (2) (b) is amended by deleting the figure "\$0.75" and inserting in lieu thereof the figure "\$1.00".

Sec. 2. Section 19-86.1, subsection (6) is to be deleted in its entirety.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall become effective January 1, 1970.
