AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 520-X, THE 1972-73 BUDGET ORDINANCE, CREATING AN ADDITIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT II IN THE UTILITIES DEPARTMENT.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte,

Section 1. That the authorized strength of Account 601 (Utilities - Administration) is hereby changed by adding one Administrative Assistant II, Class 312, Salary Range 43, for the purpose of coordinating all federal, state, and local funding for the Utilities Department.

AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING FUNDS TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEMOLITION OF
A STRUCTURE INVOLVED IN THE NORTH MCDOWELL STREET WIDENING PROJECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY the City Council of the City of Charlotte,
North Carolina.

Section 1. That the sum of \$2,000 is hereby transferred from Account 537.66 (Right of Way Payment to the State Highway Commission) to Account 537.53 (North McDowell Street Widening, Fourth to Ninth Street), these funds to be used for the demolition of an abandoned service station at the corner of North McDowell and Seventh Streets as a part of the North McDowell Street widening project.


AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING FUNDS WITHIN THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND






