AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 155-X, THE 1976-77 BUDGET ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TABLE OF ORGANIZATION FOR THE CHARLOTTE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO ADD TWO SCHOOL CROSSING GUARDS.


BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte,

That the Table of Organization for the Charlotte Police Department School Safety Division, Account 401.47, is hereby amended to add two adult school crossing guards to serve the crossway at Brookdale Avenue at the walkway to Starmount School and Barrington Drive at Rosecran Drive. This request has been reviewed by the Traffic Engineering Department and Police Department.

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING THE DEMOLITION AND REMOVAL OF THE DWELLING AT 1505 Parson St. PURSUANT TO THE HOUSING CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE AND ARTICLE 19, PART 6, CHAPTER 160A OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF NORTH CAROLINA, SAID BUILDING BEING THE PROPERTY OF T. P. Hartis and Wife, Helen RESIDING AT 1104 Jenkins Drive, Charlotte, N.C.

WHEREAS, the dwelling located at 1505 Parson Dr. in the City of Charlotte has been found by the Superintendent of Building Inspection to be unfit for human habitation and the owners thereof have been ordered to demolish and remove said dwelling, all pursuant to the Housing Code of the City of Charlotte and Article 19, Part 6, Chapter 160A of the General Statutes of North Carolina, and


AN ORDINANCE ORDERING THE DWELLING AT 1909-11 Gibbs Street
