THE PROPERTY, OWNED BY T. BRAGG MCLEOD, IS LOCATED AT 200 NORTH MCDOWELL STREET, CHARLOTTE, MECKLENBURG COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it in the public interest that hearings be held on said petitions,


