

Charlotte Regional Transportation Planning Organization (CRTPO)

- Federally-designated metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Charlotte urban area
- 3-county planning area with 24 member jurisdictions
 - Iredell
 - Mecklenburg
 - Union (urban area)
- Funding is contingent upon implementing the federallymandated 3-C transportation planning process
 - Continuing
 - Cooperative
 - Comprehensive





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- The CRTPO was awarded \$3.15 million from the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary program in September 2024
- Supplemental match funding supported by NCDOT Safety Unit

- Grant application, titled "Safety is Everyone's Business" seeks to...
 - o Engage all 24 members' staff, elected officials, and public on safety
 - Link local priorities and existing safety efforts
 - Establish a regional vision for reducing traffic injuries and deaths





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- Retain a multidisciplinary firm to:
 - Conduct transportation safety analyses
 - Develop data tools and regional priorities
 - Create a new Comprehensive Safety Action Plan for the planning area
 - Create a new or updated Safety Action Plan for each member
 - Support coordination with members developing or with adopted plan

 This RFQ is companion to a Public Outreach & Education RFP, due to be published mid-2025

Minimum Applicant Qualifications

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- Firms must be properly registered with the Office of the Secretary of State of North Carolina (as applicable)
- Firms must be licensed by the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers & Surveyors





Project Scoring Criteria

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- Qualifications and relevant experience of firm and key team members in providing similar services and projects (40%)
- Proposed and innovation (30%)
- Project understanding, methodology, and approach (20%)
- Multi-jurisdictional and federally funded project experience (10%)


