The regular weekly meeting of the City Council was held in the Council Chamber, City Hall, Wednesday, September 22, 1937, at 4:00 o'clock p. m., with Mayor Pro Tem Claude L. Albea presiding in the absence of Mayor Douglas, and Councilmen Baxter, Durham, Hovis, Hudson, Huntley, Griswold, Nance, Sides and Wilkinson being present.

Absent: Mayor Douglas and Councilman Little.

MINUTES SEPTEMBER 15TH. MEETING APPROVED.

On motion of Councilman Griswold, seconded by Councilman Wilkinson, the minutes of the September 15th. meeting were approved as read.

CHNTRAL LABOR UNION GRANTED PERMIT TO SPONSOR FIRST FALL FESTIVAL.

A delegation from the Charlotte Central Labor Union, Mr. Greene spokesman, appeared before the Council with request for permit to sponsor a carnival October 25th. thru 30th., to be known as the Central Labor Union's First Fall Festival. Mr. Greene stated that the shows to be brought to Charlotte at that time will be high type and that this carnival, as one of the terms of agreement, has asked for police protection.

On motion of Councilman Hudson, seconded by Councilman Baxter and carried, this request was granted.

TICKETS TO FOOD SHOW PRESENTED TO COUNCIL.

Mr. D. C. Staton, of the Independent Food Dealers, presented season passes to the Food Show now being held in Charlotte, to each member of the Council, for which Mayor Pro Tem Albea expressed appreciation.

SIGN AT MUNICIPAL AIRPORT TO BE ERECTED BY THE JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMURCE.

Mr. A. I. Bechtold, President of the Charlotte Junior Chamber of Commerce requested permission for the Junior Chamber to erect a large sign at the entrance of the Municipal Airport, stating that the small sign now there cannot be easily read by fast moving traffic.

Councilman Hovis, Chairman of the Airport Committee, advised that he had gone into this matter and that the sign to be erected would not in any way obstruct traffic, and moved the passage of the following resolution which he read:

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RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE TO PERMIT THE CHARLOTTE
JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE TO ERECT A SIGN AT THE
CHARLOTTE AIRPORT.

WHEREAS, the Charlotte Junior Chamber of Commerce has offered to erect an appropriate sign (approximately 10 x 20 feet) designating the entrance to the Charlotte Airport from the Wilkinson Boulevard. Said sign to be erected on the City-owned or controlled property, at or near the intersection of the road to the Airport and the Wilkinson Boulevard, without cost to the City of Charlotte.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the City Council of the City of Charlotte hereby authorized and grants permission to the Charlotte Junior Chamber of Commerce to erect, without cost to the City, on the City-owned or controlled property adjacent to the Wilkinson Boulevard, a sign designating the entrance to the Charlotte Airport.

That this Resolution be in full force and effect from and after its ratification.

Ratified, this the 22nd. day of September 1937.

Councilman Hovis' motion for adoption of the above ordinance was seconded by Councilman Hudson, and on advice of the City Manager that permission will also have to be secured from the State Highway Commission for erection of this sign on the "V" shaped piece of property, which the Highway Commission retained the right to control, the above resolution was unanimously adopted with that additional understanding.

PETITION FOR STREET LIGHT AT WEST TRADE AND CEDAR STREETS.

Mr. Gray Rankin and Dr. W. W. Akers, Pastor of West Avenue Church, presented to the Council a petition signed by a number of residents of that section, asking for a street light at the intersection of West Trade Street and Cedar Street, pointing out the urgent need of a light at this location due to two churches and two filling stations on the four respective corners.

Councilman Wilkinson, seconded by Councilman Hudson, moved that the request be granted subject to the approval of the City Manager and the Inspection Department. Motion unanimously carried.

COMMITTEE TO BE APPOINTED TO SECURE FOOTBALL GAMES FOR CHARLOTTE'S MUNICIPAL STADIUM.

Councilman Baxter brought before the Council the question of Charlotte making an effort to secure more football games for the Municipal Stadium, pointing out that Greensboro has thirteen games scheduled to be played there this year while Charlotte has only one, and he suggested that the Mayor appoint a committee of about ten men, representing the alumni associations of the various colleges to meet with the Charlotte Park and Recreation Commission and the City Council in an effort to bring additional games to Charlotte.

Councilman Sides stated that he felt that the different associations should select their own men or suggest to the Mayor the men to be appointed, which suggestion was agreeable to Councilman Baxter.

Councilman Baxter, seconded by Councilman Wilkinson thereupon moved that the Mayor appoint a committee of ten local men from the

various alumni associations of the different colleges to meet with the Charlotte Park and Recreation Commission in an effort to get college football games in Charlotte; these ten men to be suggested to the Mayor by the associations. Motion unanimously carried.

TRAFFIC LIGHTS.

Mr. Marshall advised the Council that numerous requests and petitions for street lights have been received and that inasmuch as a certain amount was budgeted for this purpose, it will be necessary for the Traffic Inspectors to meet with the Council committee and decide which lights are most needed, and that the request received today for the light at W. Trade and Cedar will have to be considered along with the others.

AGREEMENT WITH SEABOARD AIRLINE RAILWAY.

On motion of Councilman Hudson, seconded by Councilman Huntley and unanimously carried, the Mayor and Clerk were authorized to execute an agreement with the Seaboard Airline Railway covering the installation of underground water mains at Pecan, Brevard and Sixth Streets.

PURCHASE OF METAL CULVERT FOR CREEK CROSSING AT ENTRANCE ELMWOOD CEMETERY.

On motion of Councilman Wilkinson, seconded by Councilman Griswold and carried, the Mayor and Clerk were authorized to sign a contract with the Dominion Metal and Culvert Corporation for 35 Lineal Feet of $5\frac{1}{2}$ ft. diameter corrugated metal Culvert for creek crossing at the entrance to Elmwood Cemetery from Sixth Street, at a total price of \$203.64 delivered.

PERMISSION GRANTED FOR CONSTRUCTION OF WOODEN STRUCTURE ON CENTRAL AVENUE.

On motion of Councilman Griswold, seconded by Councilman Hudson and carried, application for the construction of a temporary wooden building, 50' x 100' on property at the rear of 1023 Central Avenue, by the Community Church, was approved.

MOTICE OF SUIT OF ODELL OSBORNE VS. CITY OF CHARLOTTE.

The City Manager reported receipt of notice of suit of Odell Osborne for alleged injuries received from falling into an open meter box on East 3rd. Street. Amount of the suit \$5,000.00 and the plaintiff's attorney Mr. Jake Newell. This was referred to the City Attorney.

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STREETS AT MINT MUSEUM TAKEN OVER FOR CITY MAINTENANCE.

Councilman Wilkinson, seconded by Councilman Baxter, moved that Eastover Road, for one block, and East Fourth Street and Parkside Road, each for one block, adjacent to the Mint Museum of Arts, be accepted and taken over for City maintenance. Motion carried.

EXTENSION OF SEVER HIDDLETON DRIVE.

On motion of Councilman Wilkinson, seconded by Councilman Huntley and carried, the request of Mr. E. C. Griffith for extension of a sewer 200 feet on Middleton Drive was granted; this work being estimated to cost \$176.55.

REASSESSMENT ORDINANCE - HARDING PLACE

On motion of Councilman Hudson, seconded by Councilman Baxter, the following re-assessment ordinance was unanimously adopted on three readings, and declared by the Mayor Pro Tem to be an ordinance of the City of Charlotte:

REQUEST OF PARK AND RECREATION COMMISSION FOR ADVANCE OF \$1800.00 ON UNCOL* LECTED TAXES.

Mr. Marshall advised that he had received a request from the Charlotte Park and Recreation Commission for an advance or loan of \$1800.00 on a note which they would sign, secured by uncollected back taxes the them. Mr. Marshall also stated that the Park & Recreation Commission in making up their budget did not assume any revenue from back taxes. He presented a statement of unencumbered taxes receivable of the Park and Recreation Fund, as prepared by the Municipal Accountant, showing unencumbered balance of Taxes Receivable estimated collectable of \$5,147.24.

On motion of Councilman Baxter, seconded by Councilman Wilkinson and unanimously carried, this request for loan or advance of \$1800.00 was granted.

COMPROMISE OF SUIT OF IDA CALLWELL.

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Mr. Marshall presented a letter received from the City Attorney in which he advised that the City of Charlotte compromise the suit of Ida Caldwell, for alleged injuries by stepping into a defective place in the walk at the City Hall, for the sum of \$235.00; this letter stating that plaintiff was actually injured, that there is no faked evidence in the case and that he believed it to the advantage of the City to settle this case for this amount.

Thereupon Councilman Wilkinson, seconded by Councilman Griswold, moved that the case be settled as recommended by the City Attorney.

Councilman Sides opposed this settlement, stating that the City would be setting a precedent by compromising since all other personal injury cases had been fought out in the courts, and maintained that if there was a hole large enough for a person to be injured then someone should be held responsible.

A vote was taken on the above motion, which was carried, Councilman Sides voting "No".

RESOLUTION UPON THE DEATH OF MR. OLIN A. CRENSHAW, EMPLOYEE OF CITY OF CHARLOTTE.

The following Resolution was offered by Councilman Hudson, who moved its adoption, which was seconded by Councilman Baxter and unanimously carried:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, in the divine wisdom of the Almighty God, He has seen fit to remove from our midst Olin A. Crenshaw; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Crenshaw loyally served the City of Charlotte in the Street Department for a number of years and passed away while in service, it is with deep appreciation and respect that we honor his memory.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: First, that we, as members of the City Council of Charlotte, bow in humble submission to His will, knowing that He is too kind to willingly afflict without cause.

Second: That we extend to his family our sympathy and pray God's blessings to rest upon them.

Third: That a copy of this Resolution be spread upon the

Minutes of the City Council and a copy be sent to the family of the deceased, and copies be furnished to the newspapers in the City of Charlotte.

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO RESTRICTIONS IN TERRITORY IN DILWORTH.

Councilman Baxter stated that a permit has been requested to erect a laundry on Morehead Street, which is a residential street and that it appears that the City of Charlotte will have to look ahead in order to prevent the establishing of manufacturing plants in such residential sections.

He offered the following Ordinance which he suggested be adopted on first reading only, and moved its adoption on first reading, which was seconded by Councilman Huntley:

AN ORDINANCE
BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful to erect or operate or maintain within the territory hereinafter described any manufacturing plant where machinery is used, or any laundry, or any cleaning establishment.

Section 2. That the territory to which this ordinance is applicable is as follows:

"Beginning at a point on Kenilworth Avenue, 200 feet in a northeasterly direction from its intersection with $^{\mathrm{E}}$ ast Morehead Street, and runs thence in a northwesterly direction parallel with ${\mathbb E}$ ast ${\mathbb M}_0$ rahead Street, and 200 feet therefrom, to South Caldwell Street; thence along South Caldwell Street in a southwesterly direction to Templeton Avenue; thence along Templeton Avenue in a southeasterly direction to a point 150 feet northwest from its intersection with Euclid Avenue; thence in a line parallel with Euclid Avenue in a southwesterly direction, and 150 feet therefrom, to Tremont Avenue; thence along Tremont Avenue in a southeasterly direction to Avondale Avenue and along Avondale Avenue in a southerly direction to Ordermore Avenue; thence along Ordermore Avenue in a southeasterly direction to Kenilworth Avenue; thence with Kenilworth Avenue in a northeasterly direction to the point of BEGINNING."

Section 3. That any person or corporation violating this ordinance, or any part thereof, shall be fined twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars; and each day or part thereof such violation shall continue shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 4. All ordinances, and parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. The invalidity of any part of this ordinance shall not affect the remainder thereof.

Section 6. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its ratification, and first publication in The Charlotte News.

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Councilman Sides opposed the adoption of this ordinance, in asmuch as it was confined to a rertain district, stating he would be glad to vote for an ordinance which would zone the entire city.

Against: Councilmen Durham, Hudson and Sides.

The Mayor ProlTem declared the ordinance adopted on first reading on a vote of 6 to $3 \cdot$

REPORT OF REAL ESTATE COMMITTEE WITH REFERENCE TO SALE OF OLD INCINERATOR BUILDING.

Councilman Huntley, Chairman of the Real Estate Committee, stated that they had received an additional bid of \$150.00 for this property, the old Incinerator building, but that his committee recommends that this not be sold at this time.

TWO-HOUR PARKING IN VICINITY OF COURT HOUSE.

Councilman Baxter reported for the Police Committee, that it recommends 2-hour parking on the South side of the Court House block and on the East side of South Myers Street.

Thereupon, Councilman Sides, seconded by Councilman Hovis, moved that the Police Department be requested to make such changes as are desired by the City Manager and the Police Committee. Motion carried.
