The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4 p.m., on Tuesday, September 25, 1945, with Mayor Baxter presiding, and all members of the Council being present.

MINUTES APPROVED.

Upon motion of Councilman Hinson, seconded by Councilman Childs, the minutes of the last meeting were approved as read.

REQUEST OF CHASE BRENIZER FOR SANITARY SEWER CONSTRUCTION AT BIDDLEVILLE SECTION DEVELOPMENT DENIED.

Mr. Chase Brenizer requested the construction of sewer lines within his and the adjoining property in Biddleville section, at an estimated cost of \$1,878.25, to serve 9 houses already constructed; Mr. Brenizer to post with the City \$78.25 necessary under the City's policy of \$200.00 per house. Also, that the City construct a trunk line, at it's own cost, from the present sewer to his development, estimated to cost \$1,160.50. Councilman Childs moved that the request be granted. Motion seconded by Councilman Hinson, and was lost by a vote of four to three.

Mr. Brenizer was advised that the City would construct both the lines within the development and the trunk line, on the basis of it's policy of \$200.00 per house.

TAX FORECLOSED PROPERTY AT 2425-27 HUTCHINSON AVENUE AUTHORIZED ADVERTISED FOR SALE.

Councilman Newson moved the adoption of the recommendation of the Appraisal Committee that tax foreclosed property at 2425-27 Hutchinson Avenue, being Lot 7, Block 1, Graham Heights, appraised at \$1,000.00, be advertised for sale, and the City Treasurer accept bona fide offers accompanied by 5% deposit. Motion seconded by Councilman Puette, and unanimously carried.

REQUEST OF LEX MARSH COMPANY FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SANITARY SEWER IN BARRINGER DRIVE GRANTED.

Councilman Johnston moved that a sanitary sewer be constructed in Barringer Drive, at an estimated cost of \$1,926.10, to serve 8 houses already constructed, check for \$326.10 having been posted by Lex Marsh Company in line with the City's policy. Motion seconded by Councilman Hinson, and unanimously carried.

CONSIDERATION OF REVOCATION OF TAXICAB OPERATOR'S PERMIT OF MARVIN HUTCHINS DÉFERRED.

Councilman White moved that consideration of the revocation of the Taxicab Operator's Permit of Marvin Hutchins be deferred. Motion seconded by Councilman Newson, and unanimously carried.

PURCHASES AND CONTRACTS AUTHORIZED.

Motion was made by Councilman Puette, seconded by Councilman Newson, and unanimously carried, that the following contracts and purchases be authorized, and monies appropriated from the proper fund where necessary:

- 1. Contract with Concrete Supply Company for approximately 165 tons of No. 7 and 275 tons of No. 9 crushed stone, at \$937.75.
- 2. Contract with Economy Printing Company for 10,000 voucher checks, for the Accounting Department, at a cost of \$227.80.
- 3. Payment of \$106.00 to Purity Cafe for prisoners' meals from September 1st through 15th.

REAPPOINTMENT OF FRANK O. SHERRILL TO ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH.

Councilman White moved the reappointment of Mr. Frank O. Sherrill to the Advisory Committee on Public Health, for a term of five years from the expiration of his present term of office on September 29th. Motion seconded by Councilman Hinson, and unanimously carried.

SALE OF CEMETERY LOTS AND ISSUANCE OF DEEDS AUTHORIZED.

Upon motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Childs, sale of the following cemetery lots, and issuance of deeds for same were unanimously authorized:

To - Paul B. Seanor, Lot #375, Section Y, Elmwood Cemetery, at \$35.00.
To - S. H. McDonald, Agent, Perpetual Care on Lot #14, Section P, Elmwood Cemetery, at \$144.00.
