A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, was held in the Council Chamber in the City Hall, on Wednesday, July 24, 1957, at 11 o'clock a.m., with Mayor Smith presiding, and Council-members Albea, Baxter, Brown, Dellinger, Evans, Foard and Wilkinson being

INVOCATION.

The invocation was given by Councilman Claude L. Albea.

MINUTE APPROVED.

Upon motion of Councilman Wilkinson, seconded by Councilwoman Evans, and unanimously carried, the Minutes of the last meeting on July 10th were approved as submitted.

REPRESENTATIVES OF THOMASBORO AREA TO SUBMIT PETITION SIGNED BY RESIDENTS WHO DESIRE CITY WATER SERVICE.

Mr. William H. Gale and the Reverend Sam H. Zealy were spokesmen for a delegation of residents of the Thomasboro area appearing before Council relative to the water situation. Mr. Gale stated that Mecklenburg County Commissioners, who have paid for the operation of the McCall water system in the area since May 31st, will cease such operation after July 31st, and that the residents wish to operate the system until such time as the city can extend its water lines to the area. Mr. Gale stated further that a meeting of the residents will be held in Thomasboro School building tomorrow night for the purpose of organizing a committee to operate the system, and he asked that a representative of the City be present to answer questions as to when the city's lines will be extended to the area, the cost to the residents of tapping onto the lines, et cetera. He also urged that the City extend its lines as soon as possible and asked for an estimated date. Mr. Yancey, City Manager, stated it would no doubt be some 90 days after the contract for the construction of the lines is let and pipe lines laid.

Mayor Smith asked if the residents intend operating the McCall system at their own expense until City water is furnished? Mr. Gale replied that it is their intent to operate at their own expense, if they can secure the consent of Mrs. McCall to use the system. Mayor Smith also asked the number of residents who intend to tap onto the City's system, and if Mr. Gale cannot secure their signatures to a petition for City water service at the meeting tomorrow night? Mr. Gale replied there are 80 families who definitely wish City service and probably many others who own their wells. Mr. Gale was advised that the City would supply him with application forms for City service to be signed at the meeting if he wished, which would save the City making the expensive survey of the prospective water users.

The Reverend Sam H. Zealy stated the residents of the Thomasboro area have had a change of heart about coming into the city and having city water service and are now begging for mercy, and urged the City to make \sim water available to them at the earliest possible date.

Mayor Smith stated the City's representatives will be at the meeting to a answer any questions, and he suggested that Mr. Gale and the Reverend Zealy also discuss the matter with Mr. Yancey today. Seems Foreshipping land The second of the seconds
