AMENDING CHAPTER 23,
ARTICLE VII, DIVISION 3
SECTION 23-96 (b)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 23, ARTICLE VII, DIVISION 3,
OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE WITH RESPECT TO
AMENDMENTS TO ZONING ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North
Carolina:

Section 1. Chapter 23, Article VII, Section 23-96 (b) of the Code of
the City of Charlotte is hereby amended by deleting the last sentence and
inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"A petitioner may amend or withdraw his petition only with
approval of the City Council. Requests for permission to amend
or withdraw petitions for rezoning must be filed with the City
Council prior to the date established for the public hearing. A
decision on the request will be made by the City Council on the day
of the public hearing. The City Council shall not permit an amend-
ment which would delete a portion of the land originally included
in the petition for rezoning when the effect of such deletion would
be to change the percentage of votes required for approval of the
rezoning. The City Council shall not permit a withdrawal of a
petition when protests in opposition to the proposed rezoning
sufficient to invoke the three-fourths voting rule have been filed."

Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective upon its
adoption.

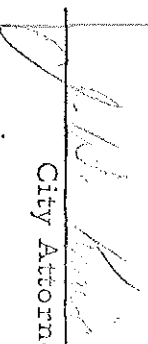
BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North

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ORDINANCE NO. 497-X

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 360-X, THE 1965-66 BUDGET ORDINANCE, AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND.

WHEREAS, additional expenditures in excess of the funds available in certain appropriations within the General Fund require that additional funds in the total amount of \$245,000. be transferred to those appropriations; and

WHEREAS, strict review and control has been exercised over all expenditures and, where possible, activities curtailed or postponed so as to provide for the increased work volumes in the critical areas indicated above resulting in unencumbered balances sufficient to permit a transfer of funds in the total amount of \$245,000. to those appropriations, in accordance with the authority contained in G.S. 160-410.8(1), from other appropriations within the General Fund;

Now Therefore, Be It Ordained By The City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina:

Section 1. That the appropriations listed below in Column 1, as the same appear in the 1965-66 budget ordinance, be increased in the amounts specified below in Column 2 and that these increases be financed by a transfer of funds from the unencumbered balances of the appropriations listed below in Column 3 in the amounts specified below in Column 4.

Section 3. There is hereby levied the following rates of tax on each one hundred dollars (\$100) valuation of taxable property, as listed for taxes as of January 1, 1966, for the purpose of raising the revenue from Property Taxes as set forth in the foregoing estimates of revenue, and in order to finance the foregoing appropriations:

General Fund (for the general expenses incident to the proper government of the city) \$1.3121

Municipal Debt Service Fund (for the payment of interest and principal on outstanding debt) .1479

Charlotte Park and Recreation Commission .0800

TOTAL RATE PER \$100 OF VALUATION OF TAXABLE PROPERTY	\$1.54
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Such rates of tax are based on an estimated total assessed valuation of property for the purpose of taxation of \$897,100,000 and an estimated rate of collections of ninety-five percent (95%).

Section 4. There is hereby levied a poll tax of \$1.00 on all male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 unless exempt as provided by law, for the purpose of raising the revenue from poll taxes as set forth in the foregoing estimates of revenue, and in order to finance the foregoing appropriations.

Section 5. Copies of this ordinance shall be furnished to the City Treasurer and City Accountant to be kept on file by them for their direction in the disbursement of city funds.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
