RESOLUTION FIXING DATE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON  
PETITION TO CLOSE PORTION OF EAST TWENTY SIXTH STREET

WHEREAS, Southern Wipers, Inc., owns the land on both sides of a portion of East Twenty-Sixth Street running between North Davidson Street and Sugar Creek;, and

WHEREAS, this portion of East Twenty-Sixth Street is not used as a roadway by anyone other than Southern Wipers, Inc., there being no bridge across Sugar Creek at this point; and,

WHEREAS, Southern Wipers, Inc. has filed a petition addressed to The Honorable Mayor and Members of the City Council of the City of Charlotte requesting that a certain portion of East Twenty-Sixth Street be closed and abandoned, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 153, Section 9, subsection 17, and Chapter 160, Section 200, Subsection 11, of the General Statutes of North Carolina; and,

WHEREAS, the procedure for closing streets as outlined in the provisions of said statutes, requires a public hearing after notice to the abutting landowners not joining in the Petition after publication in a newspaper once a week for four consecutive weeks;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte that a public hearing on the question of closing that portion of East Twenty-Sixth Street described in said Petition signed by G. W. MacKinnon, President of Southern Wipers, Inc., shall be held at 3 P.M. on Monday, the 26th day of September, 1966, in the Council Chamber of the City Hall. The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish such a notice in the Charlotte News once a week for four consecutive weeks next preceding the date fixed here for such hearing, as required by Chapter 153, Section 9, Subsection 17, of the General Statutes of North Carolina.
