RESOLUTION CANVASSING THE RETURNS OF THE SPECIAL BOND ELECTION HELD DECEMBER 17, 1966, AND DETERMINING AND DECLARING THE RESULT THEREOF

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte: Section 1. The returns of the special bond election held in the City of Charlotte on December 17, 1966, having been received from the proper election officers and having been canvassed, the City Council has found and determined and does hereby declare:

(a) Each registrar and judge for the special bond election held in the City of Charlotte on December 17, 1966 was duly gualified by law and had taken the necessary oath.

(b) The election officers had incorporated in their returns not only the number of votes cast for and against each question submitted but also the number of voters registered and qualified to vote in each precinct in the election.

(c) At said election there were submitted to the qualified voters of said City the following questions:

Shall an ordinance passed November 7, 1966, authorizing the City of Charlotte, North Carolina to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Redevelopment Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$5,500,000 for the purpose of providing funds for apporpiration to the Redevelopment Commission of the City of Charlotte to aid said Commission in the acquisition of land and the improvement thereof by said Commission necessary in the carrying out of its lawful powers and functions, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

Shall an ordinance passed on November 7, 1966, authorizing the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Police Headquarters Building Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,000,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with the proceeds of \$2,000,000 Police Headquarters Building Bonds authorized by an ordinance passed on December 7, 1964 and approved by a majority of the qualified voters of said City who voted thereon at a special bond election on January 23, 1965 and any other available funds, for erecting and equipping a building for use as a headquarters building for the police department, including the acquisition of necessary land, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?
- 6. Shall an ordinance passed on November 7, 1966, authorizing the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Airport Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$2,900,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other avail-able funds, for enlarging and improving the Douglas Municipal Airport, owned by the City of Charlotte, including the expansion and improvement of the passenger terminal, the construction and reconstruction of runways, taxiways, ramps and concourses, the acquisition of land for construction purposes and to provide unobstructed space for the landing and taking off of aircraft and to insure safe approaches to the landing areas of said Airport and the safe and efficient operation thereof, and the acquisition and installation of navigational, lighting and other airport equipment, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

(d) No complaints have been made to the City Council against the regularity of said election.

(e) Said election and the registration therefor were duly and properly held in accordance with law.

At a special bond election held on December 17, 1966 87,861 voters were registered and qualified to vote.

At said election <u>19,358</u> votes were cast for the ordinance authorizing the City of Charlotte to contract a debt and in evidence thereof to issue not exceeding \$1,000,000 Street Bonds of said City for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for constructing the surface of streets in said City, including a street a portion of which will be located between North Graham Street and the Plaza and having as one of its principal components a structure separating the vehicular roadway from the railroad tracks at a crossing point between 16th and 36th Streets, and the acquisition of any necessary land and rights of way (such bonds to be in addition to the \$1,000,000 Street Widening, Extension and Improvement Bonds authorized by an ordinance passed on November 7, 1966), and authorizing the levy and collection of a

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sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, and <u>7,621</u> votes were cast against said ordinance, and a majority of the qualified voters of said City who voted thereon at said election having voted in favor of the approval of said ordinance, said ordinance was thereby approved and is in force and effect.

At said election 19,028 votes were cast for the ordinance authorizing the City of Charlotte to contract a debt and in evidence thereof to issue not exceeding \$1,000,000 Police Headquarters Building Bonds of said City for the purpose of providing funds, with the proceeds of \$2,000,000 Police Headquarters Building Bonds authorized by an ordinance passed on December 7, 1964 and approved by a majority of the qualified voters of said City who voted thereon at a special bond election on January 23, 1965 and any other available funds, for erecting and equipping a building for use as a headquarters building for the police department, including the acquisition of necessary land, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, and 8,002 votes were cast against said ordinance, and a majority of the qualified voters of said City who voted thereon at said election having voted in favor of the approval of said ordinance, said ordinance was thereby approved and is in force and effect.

At said election <u>19,028</u> votes were cast for the ordinance authorizing the City of Charlotte to contract a debt and in evidence thereof to issue not exceeding \$2,900,000 Airport Bonds of said City for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging and improving the Douglas Municipal Airport, owned by the City of Charlotte, including the expansion and improvement of the passenger terminal, the construction and reconstruction of runways, taxiways, ramps and concourses, the acquisition of land for construction purposes and to provide unobstructed space for the landing and taking off of aircraft and to insure safe approaches to the landing

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areas of said Airport and the safe and efficient operation thereof, and the acquisition and installation of navigational, lighting and other airport equipment, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, and <u>8,019</u> votes were cast against said ordinance, and a majority of the qualified voters of said City who voted thereon at said election having voted in favor of the approval of said ordinance, said ordinance was thereby approved and is in force and effect.
