ORDINANCE NO. 326-X

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 176-X, THE 1971-72 BUDGET ORDINANCE, TRANSFERRING \$2400 FROM THE GENERAL FUND CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO FUND THE INSTALLATION OF FLASHING LIGHTS IN THE VICINITY OF WOODLAWN AND MURRAY HILL AND IN THE VICINITY OF EASTWAY DRIVE AND SHAMROCK PARK.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina;

Section 1. That the sum of \$2400 is hereby transferred from the General Fund Contingency into Account No. 518.528 (Traffic Engineer - Traffic Signals) to fund the installation of flashing lights in the vicinity of Woodlawn and Murrayhill and in the vicinity of Eastway Drive and Shamrock Park.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 190-X, THE 1971 MODEL CITIES BUDGET ORDINANCE, AUTHORIZING THE EXTENSION OF MODEL CITIES SECOND YEAR APPROPRIATIONS FROM DECEMBER 31, 1971 TO JANUARY 31, 1972 AND REVISING APPROPRIATIONS TO ACCOMMODATE JANUARY EXPENDITURES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina; Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance 190-X is hereby amended by deleting the phrase, "and ending December 31, 1971", and substituting the following phrase, "and ending January 31, 1972", and that Section 1 "Schedule A. AMENDING CHAPTER 10
SECTION 15

ORDINANCE 328

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10, ARTICLE II, SECTION 15 OF
THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North
Carolina:


Section 1. That Chapter 10, Article II, Section 15, Subsection (c)
entitled "Curbside Service" is hereby deleted, and the following new subsection
(c) is substituted in lieu thereof:

"(c) Curbside Service. Shrubbery trimmings, tree trimmings and
lawn clippings not placed in refuse receptacles for backyard service
shall only be collected when placed at the curbside as provided in
this subsection. Shrubbery trimmings and tree trimmings shall be
placed by the occupant at the front of the premises in the grass strip
between the street and the sidewalk adjacent to that portion of the
street right of way normally used by vehicles. Shrubbery trimmings
and limbs of less than four (4) foot lengths shall be bundled or shall
be placed in containers or heavy refuse bags near the curb for
pickup. Tree limbs and other similar materials for collection
shall be cut in four (4) to five (5) foot lengths, with protruding
branches trimmed and placed in an orderly, neat manner near the
curb. In no instance shall a limb be in excess of five (5) inches
in diameter nor heavier than seventy-five (75) pounds. No tree
limbs or shrubbery trimmings cut by landscape or tree service

contractors or other commercial workmen shall be hauled by the City. Cardboard, corrugated board, kraft board, wooden crates or other similar rubbish shall be flattened and tied in bundles of such size that they can be handled by one man or placed in either plastic bags, heavy paper bags, or refuse receptacles. Provided, however, thorny vegetation when placed in small, neat piles need not be bundled in order to be collected."

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall become effective January 17, 1972.

ORDINANCE NO. 329-X

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 176-X, THE 1971-72 BUDGET ORDINANCE, TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR APPRAISAL AND SURVEYING FEES FOR A PROPOSED PARKING GARAGE SITE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina;

Section 1. That the sum of \$30,000 is hereby transferred from the General Fund Contingency to Account No. 554.01 (Central Business District Parking Garage) to provide funds for appraisal and survey fees on land being considered for a municipally owned parking garage.
