BEGINNING at a point located on the northerly boundary of an existing R-6MFH Zoning District on Woodlawn Road and approximately 125 feet south of Drexel Place, said point being further located 20 feet in an easterly direction from the northwesterly corner of said R-6MFH Zoning District, and running thence N. 6-30-15 E. 84.44 feet; thence with a line parallel to and 40 feet south of the southerly margin of Drexel Place in an easterly direction 309.34 feet; thence S. 3-17-58 E. 85.81 feet; thence N. 83-01-42W. 323.95 feet to point of BEGINNING.
