

AMENDING CHAPTER 10,  
SECTIONS 9 and 15

ORDINANCE 345

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10, SECTION 9 of ARTICLE I AND SECTION 15 OF ARTICLE II OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina:

Section 1. That Chapter 10, Article I, Section 9, Subsection (c) is hereby amended by deleting the word and figures "ten (10)", and substituting in lieu thereof the word and figure "seven (7)".

Section 2. That Chapter 10, Article II, Section 15 is hereby amended by changing the present "10-15 (f): to "10-15 (g)", and inserting a new 10-15 to read as follows:

"10-15 (f). Special collection of household furniture and appliances.

Upon request, the sanitation division shall collect normal household discarded furniture and appliances which cannot be otherwise prepared for collection pursuant to the other subsections of this section. Furniture shall include couches, chairs, tables, beds, springs, mattresses, and chests, and similar items. Appliances shall include refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, dishwashers, and similar items, but shall not include water heaters or furnaces. Persons requesting this service shall be notified as to the date collection will occur. Items for collection, pursuant to this subsection, shall be placed at the curbside no earlier than the day preceding the scheduled collection. This collection shall be available to residential areas only, and nothing in this subsection shall be construed to authorize collection which is prohibited in Sec. 10-16 (g). "

Section 3. That this ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after its adoption.



of the City Code - Zoning Ordinance

An Ordinance Amending the City Code  
with respect to the Zoning Ordinance

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE:

Section 1. That, Chapter 23, Section 23-8, of the Code of the City of Charlotte is hereby amended by changing from R-9 to R-12MF on the Official Zoning Map, City of Charlotte, N. C. and Perimeter Area the following described property:

BEGINNING at a point on a line, said line being 200 feet a perpendicular distance from southerly margin of Tuckaseegee Road and two calls from a point in the Tuckaseegee Road, said point being located at the northwesterly corner of Bethel Baptist Church property as described in a deed recorded in Deed Book 3144, Page 65 in the County Public Registry, and running thence S. 30-10-00 W. 222.03 feet; thence N. 71-23-40 W. 520.39 feet to the point of BEGINNING, running thence S. 29-56-27 W. 1593.02 feet; thence N. 60-29-43 W. 725 feet, more or less, to the Charlotte City Limits Line, and running thence with said line in a northeasterly direction 1330 feet, more or less, to a point, said point being 200 feet a perpendicular distance from southerly margin of Tuckaseegee Road; thence running with a line parallel to and 200 feet a perpendicular distance from the southerly margin of Tuckaseegee Road in an easterly direction 970 feet, more or less, to the point of BEGINNING.




