WHEREAS, the petitioners, Bill Johnson and wife, Mildred H. Johnson; Warren C. Elmore and wife, Ruby L. Elmore; Willie J. Robeson and wife, Mary A. Robeson; and Lurene B. Harris, own all of the land abutting upon said portion of Lydia Street, or the affected portions thereof; and

WHEREAS, no persons or parties in interest have appeared in opposition to the closing of said street or the portion thereof; and

WHEREAS, it has been made to appear to the satisfaction of the City Council that the closing and abandonment of said portion of Lydia Street is not contrary to the public interest and that no individuals, firms, or corporations owning property in the vicinity thereof will be deprived of reasonable means of ingress and egress to his or its property;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, that the City Council hereby orders the

closing and abandonment of that portion of Lydia Street located in the City of Charlotte, Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, designated in the aforesaid petition and more particularly described as follows:

> BEGINNING at the point of intersection of the Easterly margin of Lydia Street with the Southerly margin of Matheson Avenue (formerly Westley Avenue) said point of BEGINNING also being the Northwesterly corner of Lot 1 in Block 17 A all as shown on map recorded in Map Book 1166, page 471, and running thence from said beginning point as thus established S. 10-27 W. along the Easterly margin of Lydia Street a distance of 356.04 feet to a point in the Northerly margin of Leigh Avenue, said point also being the intersection of the Easterly margin of Lydia Street with the Northerly margin of Leigh Avenue, and also being the Southwesterly corner of Lot 1 in Block C of Plaza Hills, all as shown on map recorded in Map Book 1166, page 239, of the Mecklenburg County Public Registry; thence N. 79-33 W. 45 feet to a point in the Northerly margin of Leigh Avenue, said point being the intersection of the Northerly margin of Leigh Avenue with the westerly margin of Lydia Street and also being the Southeasterly corner of Lot 6 in Block B of Plaza Hills, all as shown on map recorded in Map Book 1166, page 239; thence along the westerly margin of Lydia Street N. 10-27 E. a distance of 359.54 feet to a point in the Southerly margin of Matheson Avenue (formerly Westley Avenue), said point being the intersection of the Westerly margin of Lydia Street with the Southerly margin of Matheson Avenue (formerly Westley Avenue) and also being the Northeasterly corner of Lot 7 in Block 18-A, all as shown on map recorded in Map Book 1166, page 471, of the Mecklenburg County Public Registry; running thence S. 75-06 E. 45 feet to a point in the Southerly margin of Matheson Avenue (formerly Westley Avenue), the point or place of BEGINNING.
