The first installment with interest shall become due and payable on the date on which taxes are payable, with one subsequent installment and interest shall be due and payable on said date in each successive year until the assessment is paid in full.

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

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
A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REFUND

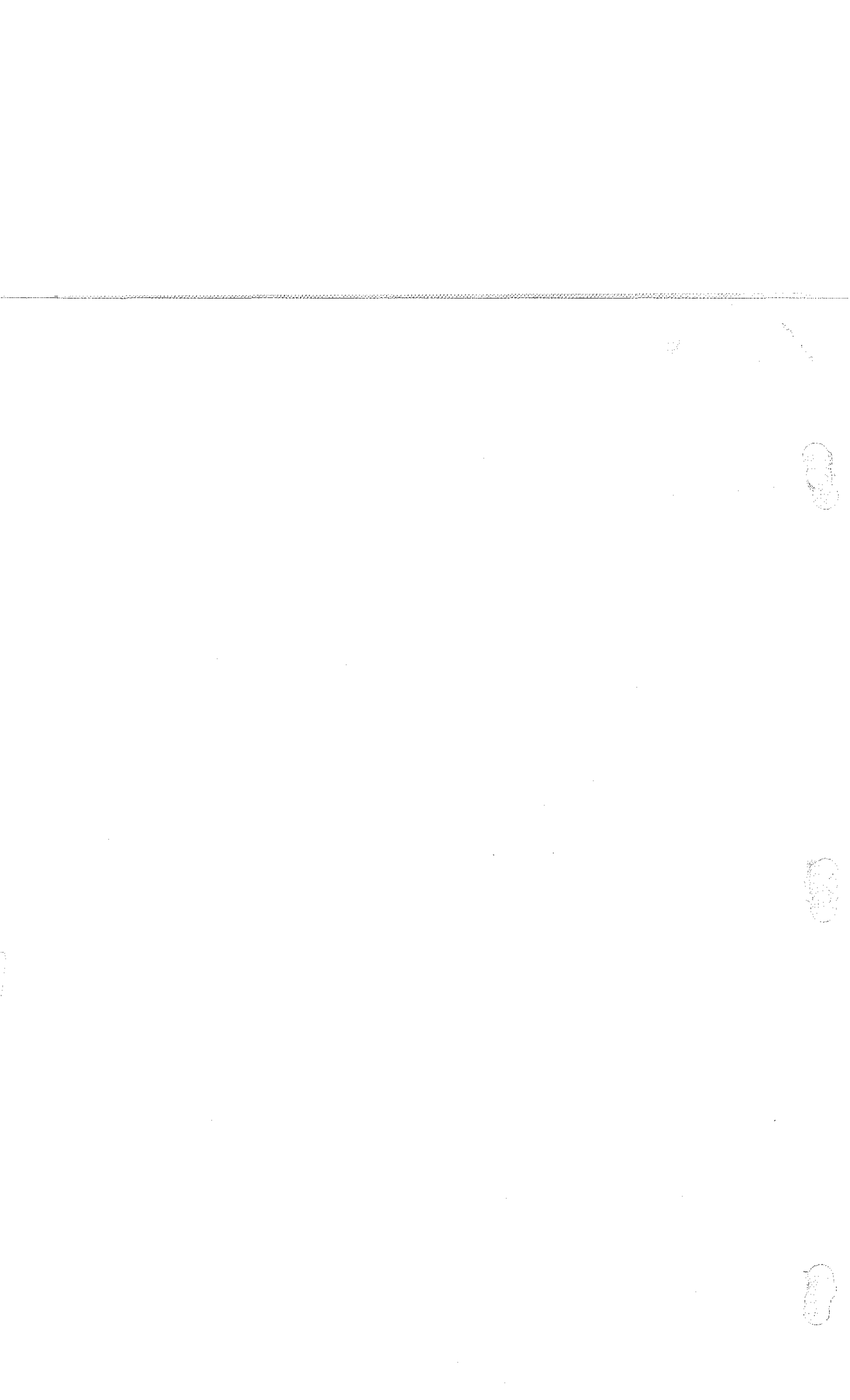
