BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE:

Section 1. That, Chapter 23, Section 23-8, of the Code of the City of Charlotte is hereby amended by changing from O-6 to I-2 on the Official Zoning Map, City of Charlotte, N. C. the following described property:

BEGINNING at a point on the southerly margin of Charles Avenue, said point being located N.75-47W. 100.0 feet from a point, said point being formed by the intersection of southerly margin of Charles Avenue and westerly margin of Yadkin Avenue, and running thence S.14-13W. 190.0 feet; thence N.75-47W. 29.18 feet; thence N.47-20-54W. 23.48 feet; thence N.14-13E. 179.14 feet to the southerly margin of Charles Avenue, running thence with said margin S.75-47E. 50.0 feet to the point of BEGINNING.


BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina:




