ORDINANCE 998

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 19, ARTICLE III, "BICYCLES" OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE.

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE

that:

Section 1. That Article III of Chapter 19 of the City Code be amended in Sec. 19-87 by the deletion of the words "police department", and substitute in lieu thereof the words, "dealer".

Sec. 2. Sec. 19-88 of Article III of Chapter 19 of the City Code shall be deleted in its entirety, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

"Sec. 19-88. Same - Issued by Dealer

Merchants licensed as retailers who include bicycles in their merchandise are hereby required to issue permanent bicycle licenses which shall be effective from the date of issue; said licenses when issued shall entitle the licensee (s) to operate such bicycle for which said license has been issued upon all the streets, alleys, and public highways, and sidewalks, except the sidewalks within the Congested Business District as defined in Section 6-34 (c).

The dealer shall make a diligent effort to determine the proper ownership of a bicycle prior to issuing a license. This may be done by viewing a bill of sale, a receipt, or any other document of ownership, including but not limited to an affidavit, when no other document is available."

<u>Sec. 3</u>. Section 19-89 of Article III of Chapter 19 of the City Code shall be deleted in its entirety, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

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"<u>Sec. 18-89</u>. Same - Plates provided by City; duty of dealer; records required.

The City shall provide license plates, which the dealer may obtain from the Charlotte Police Department's Central Services Bureau at no charge, made of metal, decal, plastic or other meterial designed to be permanent in its nature, and seals, together with registration cards, said license plates and registration cards having numbers stamped thereon in numerical order, beginning with Number 1; such license plates shall be suitable for attachment upon the frame strut which supports the seat of the bicycle. It shall be the duty of the bicycle dealer to attach one such license plate to the frame of each bicycle and to issue a corresponding registration card to the licensee. Such license plate shall remain attached during the existence of the bicycle, or until ownership changes. A copy of each license issued shall be forwarded to the Charlotte Police Department by the dealer on the last day of each month. The Chief o Police is hereby authorized to issue regulations for the purpose of implementing the distribution of bicycle licenses.'

Sec. 4. That Sec. 19-90 of Article III of Chapter 19 of the Code is hereby deleted in its entirety.

Sec. 5. That the present Sec. 19-91 shall become 19-90; 19-92 shall become 19-91; 19-93 shall become 19-92 and 19-94 shall become 19-93.

Sec. 6. That a new section 19-94 shall be added to Article III and shall read as follows:

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"Sec. 19-94. Brakes Required.

It shall be unlawful to operate a bicycle on a street, alley, or public highway of the City, unless it is equipped with a braking system in sufficient working order to control and stop the movement of the bicycle."

Sec. 7. This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.
