WHEREAS the Urban Renewal Law as set out in said Article and Chapter provides for the acquisition, preparation, sale, sound replanning, and redevelopment of property within a redevelopment area, as defined by said law; and

WHEREAS such area has been established in accordance with the requirements of such law and the said Project No. N. C. R-78 approved by the Governing Body of the City of Charlotte; and

WHEREAS such law specifically provides for the exercise of power of Eminent Domain in order that the purposes of the law as set out in said Article 37 of Chapter 160 to be achieved and accomplished, such purposes being in the public interest and designed to promote the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of this community and locality; and

WHEREAS the City of Charlotte has, under the applicable laws and regulations relating to such procedure, endeavored to establish a fair market value on properties within the area, and has in good faith through its proper agents endeavored to negotiate for the acquisition of properties within the fair market value thereof, the City of Charlotte recognizing in such negotiations that it needed to acquire said property in accordance with the said redevelopment plan previously approved; and

WHEREAS the City of Charlotte, after such fair negotiations, has of this date been unable to acquire such properties as hereinafter set out and this acquisition of such properties being essential to the achievement of the plans and accomplishment of the purpose of the redevelopment law as the same relates thereto; and

WHEREAS it therefore appears that it will be necessary for the City of Charlotte to institute condemnation proceedings under the provisions of the North Carolina Law of Eminent Domain and the exercise of powers thereunder.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, that the Council approves and hereby orders the institution of condemnation proceedings in its proper corporate name with respect to the following properties:

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> RESOLUTION OF APPLICANT AUTHORIZING AMENDMENT OF CONTRACT NC-1008-OS FOR GRANT TO ACQUIRE OPEN SPACE LAND

WHEREAS Title VII of the Housing Act of 1961, as amended, provides for the making of grants by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Secretary to states and local public bodies to assist them in the acquisition and development of permanent interests in land for open space uses where such assistance is needed for carrying out a unified or officially coordinated program for the provision and development of open space land as part of the comprehensively planned development of the urban area; and

WHEREAS the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina hereafter referred to as the Applicant, desires to acquire and develop fee simple interest to certain land known as the proposed Beal Street Park, which land is to be held and used for permanent open space land for recreation and other community activities; and

WHEREAS Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the regulations of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development effectuating that Title, provide that no person shall be discriminated against because of race, color, or national origin in the use of land acquired and/or developed; and

WHEREAS it is recognized that the contract for a federal grant will impose certain obligations and responsibilities upon the Applicant and will require among other things, (1) assurances that families and individuals displaced as a result of the open space land project will be relocated into decent, safe, and sanitary housing, (2) compliance with federal labor standards, and (3) compliance with federal requirements relating to equal employment opportunity; and

WHEREAS it is estimated that the cost of acquiring said interest will be \$547,530;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA:

1. That the existing contract for NC-1008-OS be amended to acquire properties in the vicinity of Beal Street as described in the attached description.

2. That the Mayor of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina is hereby authorized and directed to execute and to file this contract amendment with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, to provide additional information and to furnish such documents as may be required by said Department, to execute such contracts as are required by said Department, and to act as the authorized correspondent of the Applicant.

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That the proposed acquisition is in accordance with plans for the 3. allocation of land for open space uses, and that, should said grant be made, the Applicant will acquire, develop, and retain said land for the uses designated in said application and approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

4. That the United States of America and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Secretary be, and they hereby are, assured of full compliance by the Applicant with regulations of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development effectuating Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

That the Mayor of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina be authorized 5. to submit a formal amendment to the existing federal grant for the revised area; and, further, that the Mayor be authorized to execute such contracts and supply supplementary material as may be necessary with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to establish an appropriate contractual relationship between that agency and the City of Charlotte.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE MAKING AVAILABLE CERTAIN TRACTS OF CITY PROPERTY FOR USE BY THE PUBLIC FOR GARDENING. 291

WHEREAS, the cost of food has risen sharply during the past several months; and

WHEREAS, there has been a renewed interest on the part of citizens in establishing gardens to grow produce for personal use; and

WHEREAS, the City currently owns certain tracts of vacant, unused land that could be used for gardening purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is desirous of making these tracts of land available to citizens of Charlotte on a "first-come, first-served" basis, for personal gardening purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte in regular session duly assembled, that the Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to make available vacant unused tracts of land owned by the City for gardening purposes to citizens of Charlotte under the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Those citizens interested in establishing a garden on City property designated and set aside for that purpose, shall apply to the appropriate official in the Department of Public Works to obtain a permit for gardening.
- 2. The assigned City property shall be used for a family garden only and the persons permitted to use the same shall not sell or offer for sale any produce grown thereon.
- 3. The permit so assigned to a citizen is revocable at the will of the City at any time the land is needed for some other City purpose.

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4. The tracts of land so designated and assigned are to be assumed by the citizens in an "as is" condition. The City makes no representations that the tracts of land to be assigned are suitable for gardening.

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- 5. The citizens so assigned a tract for gardening purposes shall agree to hold the City harmless from any claim or damage arising out of or resulting from his gardening activity on the property.
- 6. All equipment, fertilizer, seeds or any other materials necessary for gardening shall be provided by the citizen to whom the permit is granted.
- 7. During his gardening activities, the citizen to whom a permit is assigned agrees to prevent the accumulation of noxious weeds, trash or refuse on the tract.
- 8. The citizen to whom a tract is assigned shall agree to leave the tract in the same condition that it was when the permit was issued, upon the completion of his gardening activities.
