

Ordinance No. 67-X

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 828-X, THE 1973-74 BUDGET ORDINANCE, AMENDING REVENUES AND APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE LEAA FUNDED COMMUNITY CRISIS CENTER PROJECT.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina;

Section 1. That Section I, Schedule A (General Fund Expenditures) is hereby amended to add an appropriation of \$57,786 for the operation of the LEAA funded Community Crisis Center (Open House Therapeutic Community).

Section 2. That Section II, Schedule A (General Fund Revenues) is hereby amended to increase the revenue estimate for Intergovernmental Revenue by \$57,786 representing the amount of the LEAA sub-grant award for the operation of the aforementioned project.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.
