BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE:

Section 1. Chapter 23, "Zoning" of the Code of the City of Charlotte is hereby amended as follows:


- 1. Amend Article I Off-Street Parking Requirements, Section 23-62 Schedule of off-street parking requirements by changing the use "Dwellings, multi-family in low income public housing projects ... " to read as follows:

"Dwellings, multi-family in projects operated by or for the Charlotte Housing Authority or such semi-public non-profit institutions as the Salvation Army and restricted in occupancy to persons 62 years of age or older or to persons and families within the low income group classification as defined by the Charlotte Housing Authority.
