A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING A STEP 2 EPA GRANT OFFER FOR ENGINEERING DESIGN OF METRO CHARLOTTE 201 WASTEWATER FACILITIES (C 370377-03)

WHEREAS, the Federal Water Pollution Control Act of 1972 has authorized the making of grants to aid eligible units of government in financing the cost of wastewater facilities design and construction; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Charlotte has requested a Federal grant to assist in the design of Metro Charlotte wastewater facilities projects entitled:

McAlpine Creek Plant Upgrading; Sugar Creek Interceptor; Matthews Interceptor; Toby Creek Interceptor; and Value Engineering; and,

WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency has offered the City of Charlotte a 75% grant in the amount of \$733,952;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE:

That Mr. David A. Burkhalter is hereby authorized to execute all necessary documentation in order to accept the EPA's Step 2 grant offer of \$733,952 for necessary engineering charges.

Mr. Burkhalter is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such additional information as the appropriate Federal agency may request in connection with accepting a Step 2 grant offer; to make necessary assurances as may be required; to submit grant amendments; and to execute such other documentation as may be requested in connection with accepting the grant offer.

HEARING ON PETITIONS FOR ZONING CHANGES


WHEREAS, the City Council has received petitions for zoning changes, which petitions, numbered 77-35 through 77-38 are on record in the Office of the City Clerk, and

RESOLUTION DECLARING AN INTENT TO  
CLOSE A PORTION OF CRESTBROOK DRIVE  
LOCATED IN THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE,  
MECKLENBURG COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA,  
AND CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE  
QUESTION.

WHEREAS, the Charlotte City Council has determined to consider the question of closing a portion of Crestbrook Drive in the City of Charlotte; and

WHEREAS, the portion of Crestbrook Drive to be considered for closing lies at the end of Crestbrook Drive and is more particularly described as follows:

AREA "A"

Beginning at the westernmost property corner of the Alfred A. and wife Linda P. Grant property as described in Deed Book 3623-367 and running thence N. 40-16-40 W., 23.48 feet to a point; thence in a southeasterly direction with the arc of a circular curve to the left having a radius of 40.0 feet an arc distance of 25.47 feet to a point; thence S. 51-55-26 W., 7.84 feet to the point or place of beginning and containing approximately 58 square feet.

AREA "B"

Beginning at the southernmost property corner of the Hobart R. and wife JoAnn H. Wood property as described in Deed Book 3423-367 and running thence N. 51-55-26 E., 9.77 feet to a point; thence in a southerly direction with the arc of a circular curve to the left having a radius of 40.0 feet an arc distance of 28.54 feet to a point; thence N. 40-16-40 W., 26.56 feet to the point or place of beginning and containing approximately 82 square feet.

WHEREAS, the procedure for closing streets as outlined in North Carolina General Statutes, Section 160A-299, requires that Council first adopt a resolution declaring its intent to close the street and calling a public hearing on the question; said Statute further requires that the Resolution be published once a week for four successive weeks prior to the hearing, and a copy thereof be sent by registered or certified mail to all owners of property adjoining the street as shown on the county tax records, and a notice of the closing and public hearing shall be prominently posted in at least two places along said portion of the street.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND DECLARED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, at its regularly scheduled session of July 25, 1977, that it intends to close a portion of Crestbrook Drive which lies at the end of Crestbrook Drive, and being more particularly described hereinabove, and hereby calls a public hearing on the question to be held at 2:30 p. m., on Monday, the 22nd day of August, 1977, in the Council Chamber of the City Hall. The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish a copy of this resolution in the "Charlotte News", once a week for four (4) successive weeks next preceding the date fixed here for such hearing as required by G.S. 160A-299; and further, said City Clerk is directed to send by registered or certified mail a copy of this resolution to all owners of property adjoining the said street as shown on the county tax records, as required by G.S. 160A-299. The City Engineer is hereby directed to prominently post a notice of the closing and public hearing in at least two places along the said street as required by G.S. 160A-299.
