RESOLUTION CALLING A SPECIAL BOND REFERENDUM

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte:

Section 1. A special bond referendum is hereby called to be held in the City of Charlotte on Tuesday, June 20, 1978, between 6:30 A.M. and 7:30 P.M., at which there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Charlotte the question set forth in the Notice of Special Bond Referendum included in Section 3 of this resolution.

Section 2. For said referendum, (i) the regular registration books for elections in Mecklenburg County shall be used, and the registration books, process or records shall be open for the registration of voters and for public inspection in the manner, under the conditions and at the times and places set forth in the Notice of Special Bond Referendum hereinafter provided for, (ii) the registrars, judges and other officers of elections appointed by the Mecklenburg County Board of Elections shall be the election officers for such referendum, and (iii) the precincts and voting places shall be those fixed by said County Board of Elections as provided in said Notice of Special Bond Referendum, subject to change as provided

by law.

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Section 3. The Clerk shall cause a notice to be published in <u>The Charlotte News</u> once at least fourteen days before May 22, 1978 (being the last day on which persons may register for said referendum except as otherwise provided in said notice set forth in this Section) and once again not less than seven days before such day, such notice to read substantially as follows:

A special bond referendum will be held on Tuesday, June 20, 1978, between 6:30 A.M. and 7:30 P.M., at which there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Charlotte the following question:

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Shall the order adopted on May 1, 1978, authorizing not exceeding \$47,000,000 Airport Bonds of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging and improving Douglas Municipal Airport, including the construction of a new passenger terminal complex, the construction of connecting taxiways, passenger concourses, aircraft parking ramps, aircraft parking areas, a crash fire rescue facility and garage and maintenance facilities, and the acquisition of any necessary land and equipment therefor, and authorizing the levy of taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

The question hereinabove set forth contains a statement of the purpose for which the bonds are authorized by the order referred to in such question.

If said bonds are issued taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest thereof will be levied upon all taxable property in the City of Charlotte.

For said referendum the regular registration books for elections in the County of Mecklenburg will be used and the registration books, process or records will be open for the registration of qualified persons and the acceptance of registration applications at the office of the Mecklenburg County Board of Elections, 710 East 4th Street, Charlotte, North Carolina, from Monday to Friday, inclusive, of each week, between the hours of 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. Registration applications will also be accepted by and qualified persons may also register with the registrars and judges of election for the several precincts in the City at their respective residences by appointment. In addition, certain persons in the armed forces and their spouses,

certain veterans, certain civilians working with the armed forces and members of the Peace Corps may register by mail at any time prior to said referendum in the manner provided in Article 21 of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes of North Carolina and in person at any time, including the day of said referendum.

The last day for new registration for those not now registered under Mecklenburg County's permanent registration system is Monday, May 22, 1978.

The last day on which registered voters who have changed residence from one precinct to another may transfer registration is Monday, May 22, 1978.

Any qualified voter of the County who is qualified to vote by absentee ballot in said special bond referendum may apply to the County Board of Elections for an absentee ballot. Any qualified voter who is qualified to vote by military absentee ballot pursuant to Section 163-245 of the General Statues of North Carolina may also apply for an absentee ballot as provided by Section 163-247 of the Ceneral Statutes of North Carolina.

Persons who are not certain whether they are registered to vote or qualified to vote by absentee ballot should contact the County Board of Elections at the office of said Board mentioned above.

The registration books will be open to public inspection by any registered voter of the City between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M., from Monday to Friday, inclusive, of each week at said office of the County Board of Elections, and such days are challenge days.

The registrars, judges and other officers of elections appointed by the County Board of Elections will serve as the election officers for said referendum.

> "RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA, ANNOUNCING ITS INTENT TO EXCHANGE LAND IN THE SOUTHSIDE PARK COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TARGET AREA WITH REA CONSTRUCTION COMPANY"

WHEREAS, the City of Charlotte has approved a project to realign and widen Southview Street in the City of Charlotte; and

WHEREAS, land owned by Rea Construction is required for a permanent drainage easement adjacent to the new Southview Street; and

WHEREAS, Rea Construction Company owns property on Southview Street, which said property will be damaged by the closing of a section of Southview Street; and

WHEREAS, the City of Charlotte owns land adjacent to said land owned by Rea Construction Company, which land is not required for street right-of-way purposes; and

WHEREAS, negotiations with representatives of Rea Construction Company has disclosed that the corporation is willing to exchange the portion of its property needed for a permanent drainage easement for adjacent land of the City; and

WHEREAS, N. C. G. S. 160A-271 requires the publication of a notice of the Council's intent to authorize the exchange of property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE:

1. That on Monday, <u>May 15</u>, <u>1978</u>, the City Council shall give consideration to authorizing the exchange of property between the City of Charlotte and Rea Construction Company.

2. That the land of the City of Charlotte proposed to be exchanged for the land of Rea Construction Company is land in the City of Charlotte, County of Mecklenburg, State of North Carolina, described as follows:

> Beginning at a point, said point being the intersection of the center of the right-of-way of Southview Street and the northerly property line of the Epmore, Incorporated, property (now or formerly) as described in Deed Book 1760-7; and running thence with said property line N $51^{\circ}-34'-38"$ W 71.58 feet to a point, said point lying on the easterly right-of-way line of the proposed Southview Street; thence with said right-ofway line in two courses, N $57^{\circ}-25'-05"$ E 366.24 feet to a point of curvature; thence with a curve to the left having a radius of 1,030.0 feet, an arc distance of 14.38 feet to a point, said point lying in the center of the right-of-way of Southview Street; thence with said center line S $46^{\circ}-40'-42"$ W 363.72 feet to

the point or place of beginning and containing approximately 12,862 square feet.

This land has an appraised value of \$12,000.

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3. The land of Rea Construction Company proposed to be exchanged for the land of the City, described above, is land in the City of Charlotte, County of Mecklenburg, State of North Carolina, described as follows:

> Beginning at a point, said point being located in a southwesterly direction 14.50 feet from the northernmost property corner of the Rea Construction Company property as described in Deed Book 3714-047 and running thence in a southeasterly direction 18.00 feet to a point; thence in a southwesterly direction 15.00 feet to a point; thence in a northwesterly direction 18.00 feet to a point; thence in a northwesterly direction 18.00 feet to a point; thence in a northeasterly direction 15.00 feet to the point or place of beginning and containing approximately 270 square feet.

This land, together with damages to Rea Construction Company by the closing of a section of Southview Street by the City, has an appraised value of \$12,000. A further consideration by Rea Construction Company is an agreement to negotiate a settlement instead of going to condemnation, which would increase the cost of acquisition and could result in a delay of the street improvement project.

4. Plats depicting the parcels described above are available for public inspection in the Community Development Department of the City of Charlotte, 301 South McDowell Street, Suite 510, Charlotte, North Carolina.

5. This resolution shall be published at least 10 days before the regular meeting at which approval of this exchange shall be considered.

6. The foregoing Resolution was adopted by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, on May 1, 1978.
