ORDINANCE NO. 734-X

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 394-X, THE 1980-81 BUDGET ORDINANCE, TRANSFERRING FUNDS FROM THE UNAPPROPRIATED BALANCE OF THE AIRPORT OPERATING FUND TO PROVIDE AN APPROPRIATION FOR REPAIRS TO THE MUNICIPAL AIR CARGO BUILDING.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina;

Section 1. That the sum of \$67,800 is hereby transferred from the unappropriated balance of the Airport Operating Fund to the Municipal Air Cargo Building Repairs account (562.59). These funds will be used to repair damages from fire in the Eastern Airlines cargo area.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.




