AMENDING CHAPTER 13

ORDINANCE 1298

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 13 OF THE CITY CODE REGULATING THE CONSUMPTION OF BEER AND WINE IN CERTAIN AREAS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina that:

Section 1. Section 13-4.1 shall be repealed in its entirety and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

- "Sec. 13-4.1 Beer and wine; consumption and disposal of containers.
- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to consume any wine or beer upon the private business premises of another without permission of the owner or person in control of such premises.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for any person to drop, throw, cast or deposit any used wine or beer container upon any public street or sidewalk, or upon the private premises of another without permission of the owner or person in control of such premises.
- (c) For the purposes of this section "public street" shall be defined as follows:
 - (1) "Public street" shall mean any highway, road, street, avenue, boulevard, or other way within and under the control of the City of Charlotte and open to public use, including the sidewalks of any such street.
- (d) Except as permitted in Section (e) hereafter, no person shall consume any beer or wine upon or within the limits of any public street or sidewalk in the City of Charlotte.
- (e) Exception. Consumption of beer and wine is permitted during any community sponsored public function, festival or celebration being conducted within a public street, sidewalk or other publicly owned area pursuant to a written permit issued by the City Council. This permit when issued will

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also allow the sale, service and distribution of beer and wine on designated streets, sidewalks and areas reserved for the event subject to all applicable ABC regulations. Provided, however, before such permit is issued under this section, the City Council shall designate the boundaries of the event and temporarily close those streets within the boundaries for general public use.

(f) <u>Permits.</u> Application forms for the permit referred to above are available in the Office of the Director of the Park and Recreation Department, and must be filed at least twenty-one days prior to the opening day of the event."

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 1184-X, THE 1982-83 BUDGET ORDINANCE, ESTIMATING STATE REVENUES FOR VARIOUS WATER MAIN CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS.
