WHEREAS, the petitioner has caused a copy of the Resolution of Intent to close certain streets and alleyways to be sent by registered or certified mail to all owners of property adjoining the said streets and alley ways, and prominently posted a notice of the closing and public hearing in at least two places along said streets and alleyways, all in accordance with said Statute; and

WHEREAS, no persons, firms, or corporations or parties in interest have appeared in opposition to the closing of said streets and alleyways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina at its regularly assembled meeting of September 26 , 19 83 , that the Council hereby orders the closing of said streets and alleyways in the City of Charlotte, Mecklenburg County, North Carolina as described below:

FIVE POINTS NEIGHBORHOOD STRATEGY AREA RIGHT OF WAY ABAONDMENTS

NORTH SUMMIT AVENUE

VINE STREET

Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the easterly right of way margin of Fraizer Street with the southerly right of way margin of Cassey Court, and running thence with the easterly right of way margin of Fraizer Street N30°-13'-30"E, 27.72 feet to a point; thence with the northerly right of way margin of Cassey Court S59°-28'-35"E, 120.00 feet to a point in the westerly margin of an alleyway; thence with the westerly margin of said alleyway S30°-14'-00"W, 27.71 feet to a point in the southerly right of way margin of Cassey Court N59°-28'-46"W, 120.00 feet to the point or place of beginning; containing 3,325 square feet or 0.076 acres all as shown on a map prepared by the City of Charlotte, Engineering Department dated June 7, 1982, incorporated herein and marked Exhibit "F" to which reference is hereby made.

MONTGOMERY STREET

Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the easterly right of way margin of Fraizer Street with the southerly right of way margin of Montgomery Street, and running thence with the easterly right of way margin of Fraizer Street N30°-16'-49"E, 38.30 feet to a point; thence with the northerly right of way margin of Montgomery Street S59°-28'-48"E, 250.74 feet to a point in the northwesterly right of way margin of Interstate 77; thence with the northwesterly right of way margin of Interstate 77 S53°-33'-40"W, 41.62 feet to a point; thence with the southerly right of way margin of Montgomery Street N59°-28'-48"W, 234.29 feet to the point or place of beginning; containing 9,288 square feet or 0.213 acres all as shown on a map prepared by the City of Charlotte, Engineering Department, dated June 7, 1982, incorporated herein and marked Exhibit "G" to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certain portion of North Summit Avenue be retained as a 15-foot utility easement for the purpose of maintaining an existing 8-inch sewer main, and the City of Charlotte does hereby specifically reserve an utility easement, said easement being shown on a map entitled, "R.O.W. To be Abandoned, N. Summit Ave.", prepared by the City of Charlotte, Engineering Department, dated June 7, 1982, attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A" to which reference is hereby made.



A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE AMENDING A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE CHARLOTTE HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, on June 7, 1976, the City Council adopted a resolution (Resolution Book 11, p. 449) establishing the Charlotte Historic Commission; and

whereas, on June 20, 1977 (Resolution Book 12, p. 422) and on November 16, 1981 (Resolution Book 17, p. 427) the City Council adopted amending resolutions; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is desirous of adding two additional representatives for the newly designated Dilworth Historic District to the Charlotte Historic District Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Charlotte the following criteria shall apply to membership to the Charlotte Historic District.

- 1. The Charlotte Historic District Commission shall consist of eight members.
- 2. A majority of members of the Commission shall have demonstrated special interest, experience, or education in history or architecture, which is required by North Carolina General Statute § 160A-396.
- 3. All the members of the Commission shall reside within the corporate limits of the City of Charlotte, which is required by North Carolina General Statute § 160A-396.
- 4. One member of the Charlotte Historic District

 Commission shall be a representative of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg

 Planning Commission but such representative shall not need to be

- a member of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission. The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission shall recommend the representative to the City Council and Mayor.
- 5. The Fourth Ward Historic District and Dilworth Historic District shall each have one, residential property owner appointment to the Commission. That appointment shall be filled by a property owner from the Fourth Ward Historic District and from the Dilworth Historic District. The neighborhood association of each district shall provide the Mayor and City Council with nominations for an appointment for that particular historic district. Such nominations shall be recommended by the board of directors of the neighborhood association in compliance with the neighborhood association's bylaws, but such nominations shall not be binding on the Mayor and City Council.
- 6. Because the Dilworth Historic District consists of both residential uses and business uses, while the Fourth Ward Historic District is almost exclusively residential uses, the Dilworth Historic District shall have an additional representative who shall be the operator of a business in the Dilworth Historic District. Operators of businesses in the Dilworth Historic District shall be permitted to submit no more than three names to the Mayor and City Council for consideration in appointing one business representative to the Commission for the Dilworth Historic District, but such nominations shall not be binding on the Mayor and City Council.

a member of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission. The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission shall recommend the representative to the City Council and Mayor.

- 5. The Fourth Ward Historic District and Dilworth Historic District shall each have one, residential property owner appointment to the Commission. That appointment shall be filled by a property owner from the Fourth Ward Historic District and from the Dilworth Historic District. The neighborhood association of each district shall provide the Mayor and City Council with nominations for an appointment for that particular historic district. Such nominations shall be recommended by the board of directors of the neighborhood association in compliance with the neighborhood association's bylaws, but such nominations shall not be binding on the Mayor and City Council.
- 6. Because the Dilworth Historic District consists of both residential uses and business uses, while the Fourth Ward Historic District is almost exclusively residential uses, the Dilworth Historic District shall have an additional representative who shall be the operator of a business in the Dilworth Historic District. Operators of businesses in the Dilworth Historic District shall be permitted to submit no more than three names to the Mayor and City Council for consideration in appointing one business representative to the Commission for the Dilworth Historic District, but such nominations shall not be binding on the Mayor and City Council.

- 7. If the appointee for the Fourth Ward Historic District or the two appointees for the Dilworth Historic District cease to be in the historic district during their tenure on the Charlotte Historic Commission, then that appointee shall not be permitted to continue on the Commission, if more than 50% of their term has not been served.
- 8. The eight-member Historic District Commission shall be increased by the addition of one member owning property within any new historic district designated by the City of Charlotte after the adoption of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or amending resolutions pertaining to the Historic District Commission that are contrary or inconsistent with this resolution shall be null and void.

Except as specifically amended herein, the terms and conditions of the June 7, 1976 resolution and any subsequently adopted resolutions, that are not contrary or inconsistent with this resolution, shall remain in full force and effect.


