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ORDINANCE 1621

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 20, SECTION 86 OF THE CHARLOTTE CITY CODE

WHEREAS, on May 14, 1984, the Charlotte City Council approved a policy to provide for a 25 mile per hour speed limit on non-thoroughfare residential streets; and

WHEREAS, the residents of certain streets have submitted a petition signed by at least 75 percent of the residents of the streets affected; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined, upon the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation, that the speed limit on certain streets of the City of Charlotte should be established; and

WHEREAS, G. S. 20-141 (speed restrictions) requires adoption of a speed limit ordinance to amend Chapter 20, Section 86(c) of the Charlotte City Code,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte,

SECTION 1: That Schedule 10 referred to in Chapter 20-86(c) of the Charlotte City Code be amended by declaring speed limits on the following City System streets as described below:

| | STREET AND DESCRIPTION | SPEED LIMIT |

| 1. | Cleveland Avenue between East Boulevard and South Boulevard. | 25 |
| 2. | Cottage Place between Providence Road and Cherokee Road. | 25 |
| 3. | Logie Avenue, from Central Avenue to end of street 1381 feet north of Central Avenue. | 25 |

SECTION 2: Section 1 shall become effective upon adoption and after signs are erected giving notice of the speed limits as required by N.C.G.S. Section 20-141.

ORDINANCE NO. 1622

AMENDING CHAPTER 10

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10, ENTITLED "HEALTH AND SANITATION" OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, that:

Section 1. Chapter 2, § 10-16(4) "Central business district", of the City Code shalf be deleted in its entirety and in lieu thereof shall be the following:

> "§ 10-16(4). Central Business District and Tryon Street Mall.

For purposes of this subsection, Central Business District ('CBD') refers to the area included between Graham Street, West 11th Street, McDowell Street, and Morehead Street except for the geographic area described in the following paragraph as the 'Tryon Street Mall'.

Tryon Street Mall ('Mall') refers to the area of Tryon Street beginning at Stonewall Street and extending to Eighth (8th) Street, including the blocks designated as the 100 blocks of East and West Trade Street, and includes both sides of Tryon Street and Trade Street as described above.

Collection in the CBD and the Mall shall be limited to a maximum of eight (8) 32-gallon refuse containers or the equivalent placed in securely tied 2-ply plastic bags. All cardboard boxes and cartons must be placed at curbside.

Containers, cardboard boxes, cartons, or bags of garbage or trash shall be placed at curbside in the CBD between 9:00-10:00 a.m. Monday through Friday and shall be removed from the sidewalks within one (1) hour after collection. The same (i.e. containers, cardboard boxes, etc.) shall be placed at curbside on the Mall only between 8:30-9:00 a.m. Monday through Friday and shall be removed from the sidewalks by 10:30 a.m.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective upon
