

ORDINANCE NO. 2613

AMENDING CHAPTER 3

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3, "ANIMALS," OF THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, that:

Section 1. Chapter 3 of the City Code shall be amended by adding thereto a new § 3-21, entitled "Festivals: Animals prohibited," to read as follows:

"§ 3-21. Festivals: Animals prohibited.

(a) Applicability. SpringFest, JazzCharlotte, and Festival in the Park ("festivals") attract an extraordinarily large number of spectators, congested into a limited area, for a festival that is of greater duration than other community events. The presence of animals at those festivals poses some concerns for both spectators and for the animals. In addition to the above-mentioned festivals, sponsors of other festivals may request the City Manager or his authorized designee in writing to apply the provisions of this section to such festivals. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to approve such requests if he determines that the number of spectators, the size of the area or that public safety or health would warrant the application of the provisions of this section.

(b) Unlawful to have animal at a festival. It shall be unlawful for any person owning or having possession, charge, custody or control of any animal as defined in § 3-1, to take that animal, whether on a leash or not on a leash, into or allow the animal to enter the boundaries of SpringFest, JazzCharlotte, or Festival in the Park. The boundaries and the interior of SpringFest, JazzCharlotte, and Festival in the Park shall consist of any area that is part of the festival and shall include any public street, sidewalk, or other publicly-owned area.

(c) Failure to remove animal. It shall be unlawful for any person with an animal within the boundaries of those festivals to fail to obey the command of a law enforcement officer or of a park officer, as referred to in Code § 15-144, to remove such animal from the festival.

(d) Exception. This section shall not apply to those animals that are part of an authorized exhibit. Animal Control Division officers shall have the authority to specify the conditions for having such animals for the protection of the public and for the well-being of the animals. This section shall also not apply to guide dogs.

(e) Enforcement. Any member of the Animal Control Division, any law enforcement officer or any park officer may issue a

citation for a violation of this ordinance in the amount of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars. This shall not preclude in any way any law enforcement officer or park officer from exercising any authority, or carrying out any duties, of a law enforcement officer or of a park officer. Enforcement of an unpaid citation may be by issuance of a criminal summons or by the filing of a civil complaint, to collect the unpaid debt owed to the City."

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective upon adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 2614-X

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 2428-X, THE 1988-89 BUDGET ORDINANCE, ESTIMATING FEDERAL GRANT REVENUES AND PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE CITY-WIDE RENTAL REHABILITATION LOAN PROGRAM.

ORDINANCE 2616AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14, SECTION 131 OF THE CHARLOTTE CITY CODE

WHEREAS, on May 14, 1984, the Charlotte City Council approved a policy to provide for a 25 miles per hour speed limit on non-thoroughfare residential streets; and

WHEREAS, the residents of certain streets have submitted a petition signed by at least 75 percent of the residents of the streets affected; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined, upon the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation, that a lowered speed limit on certain streets of the City of Charlotte is not inappropriate; and

WHEREAS, G. S. 20-141 (speed restrictions) requires adoption of a speed limit ordinance to amend Chapter 14, Section 131(c) of the Charlotte City Code,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte,

SECTION 1: That Schedule X referred to in Chapter 14-131(c) of the Charlotte City Code be amended by declaring speed limits on the following City System Streets as described below:

<u>STREET AND DESCRIPTION</u>	<u>SPEED LIMIT</u>
1. Craftsbury Road between Barrington Drive and dead end	25
2. Hampton Avenue between Hanson Drive and Oxford Place	25
3. Racine Avenue between Graham Street and dead end	25

SECTION 2: Section 1 shall become effective upon adoption and after signs are erected giving notice of the speed limits, as required by N.C.G.S. Section 20-141.
