ORDINANCE NO. 2721

AMENDING CHAPTER 10

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10, ENTITLED "HEALTH AND SANITATION", OF THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, NC, that:

 $\underline{\text{Section 1}}$ . Chapter 10 of the City Code of the City of Charlotte shall be amended as follows:

- 1. Amend Chapter 10 by adding a new § 10-32.1, "Temporary collection practices", to read as follows:
  - "§ 10-32.1 Temporary collection practices.
  - Purpose and thirty (30) days collection practices: In view of Hurricane Hugo and the unprecedented need of the City to undertake collection of yard trash, as defined in Chapter 10, the collection practices set forth in \$ 10-31, 'Garbage', and \$ 10-32, 'Household trash', shall be suspended for a period of up to thirty (30) days from October 9, 1989. The City Manager shall have the authority to terminate the temporary collections practices set forth below before the expiration of the thirty (30) days and resume normal service if circumstances warrant.
  - (b) Temporary changes in collection practices.

    During the thirty (30) days garbage and household trash shall not be collected by backyard
    refuse collection service. Garbage and trash
    shall only be collected at curbside on that day
    ordinarily scheduled for backyard collection
    service. Any trash contained in a box, bag or
    can will be picked up. No garbage or household
    trash shall be collected on the day scheduled
    for curbside collection.
  - (c) <u>Termination of this section</u>. This section shall automatically terminate on November 7, 1989."

Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.
