WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation has plans to make certain street and highway improvements within this Municipality, said plans consisting of the construction of the Charlotte Outer Loop from east of I-77 to the US 521 interchange in Charlotte; and,

WHEREAS, the Municipality has plans to construct the Westinghouse Boulevard Extension from Old Nations Ford Road to US 521; and,

WHEREAS, said Department of Transportation and the Municipality of Charlotte propose to enter into an Agreement for the above-captioned projects whereby:

- (1) The Municipality agrees to effect the necessary adjustment of any utilities under franchise without cost to the Department of Transportation; and,
- (2) The Department shall acquire the right-of-way, relocate any utilities (except those under franchise agreement) and construct the Outer Loop Project;
- (3) The Municipality agrees to acquire the right-of-way in the vicinity of McDevitt and Street Company for both the Outer Loop Project and the Westinghouse Boulevard Extension at no expense to the Department.
- (4) The Department agrees to construct an overpass over the Westinghouse Boulevard Extension as part of the Outer Loop Project;
- (5) The Department agrees to construct the Westinghouse Boulevard Extension as a 52-foot curb and gutter section between the proposed frontage road and Old Nations Ford Road, providing access to the Hand property;
- (6) The Municipality agrees to construct the Westinghouse Boulevard Extension from Old Nations Ford Road to US 521 by June 1991.
- (7) The Municipality agrees to make certain improvements to the intersection of NC 521 and Westinghouse Boulevard Extension; and
- (8) The Municipality agrees to extend the Westinghouse Boulevard bridge by fourteen (14) feet subject to reimbursement by the Department for this work; and

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WHEREAS, the Department shall provide for the establishment, maintenance, and enforcement of traffic operating controls for the regulation and movement of traffic on the project upon its completion.

RESOLUTION OF THE CHARLOTTE CITY COUNCIL AMENDING ITS PROCEDURE FOR THE NOMINATION, CONSIDERATION AND APPOINTMENT OF PERSONS TO CITY BOARDS, COMMITTEES AND COMMISSIONS.

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, that it hereby amends its procedure for the nomination, consideration and appointment of persons to City boards, committees and commissions, by deleting the procedures set forth in Resolutions of May 29, 1978, December 11, 1978 and July 14, 1980 in their entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

1. At least four weeks prior to the quarterly date for nominations, the City shall publicize that nominations for appointment will be made by the Council and shall solicit citizens of the community to apply for appointment. Resignations received will be held over until the next quarter. Terms expiring during any quarter shall remain filled by the person then holding the position and until a successor (if any) is named.

2. At the first regular meeting of the first month of each quarter (January, April, July and October), provided that meeting falls early in the month, each member of the City Council shall have the opportunity to nominate one person for appointment to each of the positions to be filled. Forms will be provided to Council on which to write nominations. After Council has made nominations, forms shall be handed to the City Clerk. No nominations may be made after this meeting. If there is only one nominee, the appointment may be made by voice vote at the same meeting at which the nomination is made. Should the first regular meeting not fall early in the month, nominations shall be made the last regular meeting of the preceding quarter.

3. At the next regular meeting following the closing of nominations, the Council shall vote on the nominees for the positions to be filled. The appointments shall be determined by written ballot. The ballot containing the names of nominees, as well as a space for "none of the above," shall be

distributed to each Council member. Each Council member shall vote for a nominee, or for no nominee, sign the ballot and return it to the City Clerk who shall tally and announce the votes, and the results.

In accordance with the City Charter, no nominee shall be deemed appointed unless he or she receives at least six (6) votes. If no nominee receives at least six (6) votes on the first ballot, the balloting process shall be repeated for one additional time. Only the top two (2) vote getters shall be candidates for appointment on the second ballot. If as a result of the first ballot a tie vote situation produced more than two (2) top vote getters, (i.e. 3-3-3-2; 5-3-3; 4-2-2-2-1), the Council shall conduct a separate balloting to narrow the field of candidates to two (2). The top two (2) vote getters shall then be voted upon at second balloting. If no nominee receives at least six (6) votes after the second balloting, each Council member shall have an opportunity to make one additional nomination at the next meeting. All nominations made shall lay on the table for a period of two weeks, and the balloting shall be done in accordance with this paragraph at the third Council meeting following the date of nominations.

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH SPRINGFEST, INC., AND AUTHORIZING OTHER NECESSARY ACTION FOR SPRINGFEST 1989.**

WHEREAS, SpringFest, Inc., ("SpringFest"), a private, nonprofit corporation who underscores to guests and visitors the attractiveness of Charlotte for the expansion of social, cultural, and economic relationships, shall be responsible for the carrying out of SPRINGFEST 1989, which is a major community celebration of the City of Charlotte's unique historical and cultural heritage and the City of Charlotte's revitalization of Central Charlotte and shall be a three-day, outdoor, community celebration of the City during April 28, 29, and 30, 1989 with participation by artists, arts and crafts exhibitors, merchants, vendors, and others active in uptown promotion and with the City of Charlotte providing solely ancillary services as requested by SpringFest; and

WHEREAS, SpringFest and the City wish to enter into the attached Agreement;

WHEREAS, SpringFest requests the City Manager to close certain streets on specified dates, as set out in the Agreement, in order to establish the location and boundaries necessary for the event, the use of certain sidewalks within the boundaries of the closed streets for the location of exhibits, booths, displays, artists and vendors, and the use of Fourth Ward Park, Settler's Cemetery, and other open property for children's and other recreational activities, crowd assembly and control, and other planned activities; and

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WHEREAS, SpringFest requests that the City Manager issue a permit for the consumption of beer and wine during this community celebration pursuant to and in accordance with City of Charlotte Code Sec. 15-3(e); and

WHEREAS, SpringFest requests approval to levy such fees as may be necessary to cover those costs associated with planning, organizing and conducting SPRINGFEST 1989 and these fees (e.g., registration) shall be in addition to any other City fees or licenses normally required to cover business activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, in regular session duly assembled that it wholeheartedly endorses the organization of SpringFest, Inc.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council authorizes the following:

1. The proper execution by the City of Charlotte of the attached Agreement with SpringFest, Inc.
2. The temporary closing of the streets designated in the Agreement.
3. The use of City sidewalks within the boundaries of the closed streets for the location of exhibits, booths, displays, and the like.
4. The use of Fourth Ward Park, Settler's Cemetery, and other designated open public space for various activities planned for the event.

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5. The issuance of a permit for the consumption of beer and/or wine so long as all requirements of City of Charlotte Code Sec. 25-3(e) are complied with.
6. SpringFest, Inc., is hereby authorized to charge reasonable fees to persons and groups who wish to exhibit or vend. The fees shall be in addition to any other City fees normally required to conduct business activities. SpringFest shall have the authority to assign exhibition and vending space.
7. That the City Manager or his designee is authorized to take whatever other action is necessary in order to carry out **SPRINGFEST 1989**.

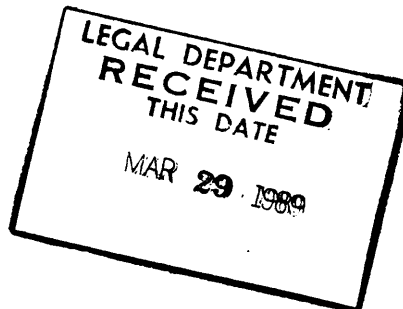
