



A Resolution of the Charlotte City Council Requesting Full State Funding for Reimbursements to Local Governments

WHEREAS, it has been reported that the North Carolina Legislature is considering reducing, by 10%, funding of their commitment toward reimbursing local governments for lost revenue from State repeals of local taxes; and

WHEREAS, a 10% reduction in reimbursements would deduct approximately \$941,000 (approximately 1/2 cent on our property tax rate) from our newly proposed budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte at it's regularly scheduled meeting on June 11, 1990, that it hereby request continued full funding by the State of reimbursements to local governments.
