ORDINANCE NO. 3177

AMENDING CHAPTER 11, ARTICLE III, SECTION 11-35 OF THE CITY CODE

AN ORDINANCE EXCLUDING OWNER-OCCUPANTS FROM LIABILITY FOR HOUSING CODE CIVIL PENALTIES AND AUTHORIZING THE RELEASE OF CIVIL PENALTIES.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina that:

Section 1. Subsections (b) and (c) of Section 11-35  $\phi$ f the Code of the City of Charlotte shall be rewritten to read as follows:

"(b) Any owner of a dwelling, except an owner who occupies the dwelling as his principal place of residence, who fails to comply with an order of the director to repair, alter, or improve the dwelling, or to vacate and close and remove or demolish the dwelling, within the time specified in the order, shall be subject to a civil penalty in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100) for the first day of noncompliance and ten dollars (\$10) for each day thereafter until the dwelling is brought into compliance with the order. This penalty may be recovered by the City in a civil action in the nature of debt if the owner does not pay the same within the thirty (30) days after the initial day of noncompliance."

"(c) The Director, in his discretion, may agree, in writing only, to release, in whole or in part, an owner from liability for the civil penalty imposed pursuant to subsection (b) of this section if the owner voluntarily agrees, as consideration for the release, to covey to the City or to some other person or organization the property from which the civil penalty arose, upon such terms and conditions as the parties might agree."

<u>Section 2.</u> This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.
