

CAROLINAS URBAN COALITION RESOLUTION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY

WHEREAS, the Carolinas Urban Coalition consists of the City of Charlotte, Concord, Kannapolis, Mooresville, Gastonia, Rock Hill, Monroe and radius, and

WHEREAS, the Carolinas Urban Coalition's focus is cooperating on issues that can best be addressed in a regional fashion, and

WHEREAS, the Carolinas Urban Coalition on January 20, 1994 conducted a public workshop where all members presented high priority issues that need state attention for addressing the serious crime problems within our region, and

WHEREAS, the Carolinas Urban Coalition voted to support the Legislative Special Session in dealing with the Governor's proposals and other issues which are of major importance to the Coalition.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Carolinas Urban Coalition fully endorses the following:

- A statewide Comprehensive Criminal Justice Information System that reports crime data in a systematic way to allow individual law enforcement units to have full information about criminal records that are accumulated in other jurisdictions.
- That North Carolina municipalities and/or Housing Authorities be given greater authority to evict residents of public housing when individuals within the respective units are convicted of felonious behavior.
- That North Carolina cities be given greater authority to combat public nuisances such as: abandoned cars, boarded up houses and other substandard structures which foster criminal behavior.
- All juvenile court records be allowed in courts to give an accurate account of past behavior of young repeat offenders who reach the age of 16 (adults).

FURTHERMORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Carolinas Urban Coalition is endorsing this resolution so we might make our united efforts known to the Legislature during the February 8 Special Session.
