

RESOLUTION DECLARING AN INTENT TO ABANDON AND  
CLOSE HIGH AVENUE AND A PORTION OF GREENWOOD  
AVENUE LOCATED OFF HUTCHINSON-MCDONALD ROAD IN  
THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE, COUNTY OF MECKLENBURG,  
STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, NationsBank of North Carolina, N.A., Trustee, has filed a Petition to close High Avenue and a portion of Greenwood Avenue in the City of Charlotte; and

WHEREAS, Greenwood Avenue and High Avenue petitioned to be closed lie off Hutchinson-McDonald Road as shown in a map marked "Exhibit A," and is more particularly described by metes and bounds in a document marked "Exhibit B," both of which are available for inspection the Office of the City Clerk, City Hall, Charlotte, North Carolina.

WHEREAS, the procedure for closing streets and alleys as outlined in the North Carolina General Statutes, Section 160A-299 requires that Council first adopt a resolution declaring its intent to close the street and calling a public hearing on the question; said Statute further requires that the resolution shall be published once a week for two successive weeks prior to the hearing, and a copy thereof be sent by registered or certified mail to all owners of property adjoining the street as shown on the county tax records, and a notice of the closing and public hearing shall be prominently posted in at least two places along said street or alley; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, at its regularly scheduled session of February 27, 1995, that it intends to close Greenwood Avenue and High Avenue lying off Hutchinson-McDonald Road, said street being more particularly described on a map and by a metes and bounds description available for inspection in the City Clerk's office, and hereby calls a public hearing on the question to be held at 7:00 p.m., on Monday, the 27th day of March, 1995, at CMGC, 600 E. Foruth Street.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish a copy of this resolution in the Mecklenburg Times once a week for two successive weeks next preceding the date fixed there for such hearing, as required by N.C.G.S. 160A-299.

**RESOLUTION DECLARING AN INTENT TO ABANDON AND  
CLOSE PORTION OF ALLEY LOCATED  
PERPENDICULAR TO THE PLAZA AND WITHIN THE  
1300 BLOCK OF THE PLAZA IN THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE,  
MECKLENBURG COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA**

WHEREAS, Plaza Central, LLC has filed a Petition to close a portion of the alley located in the 1300 block between The Plaza and Thomas Avenue (the "Alley") in the City of Charlotte; and

WHEREAS, the portion of the Alley petitioned to be closed lies parallel to Central Avenue, runs perpendicular to The Plaza and is located within the 1300 block of The Plaza as shown in a map marked "Exhibit A," and is more particularly described by metes and bounds in a document marked "Exhibit B," both of which are available for inspection in the Office of the City Clerk, City Hall, Charlotte, North Carolina.

WHEREAS, the procedure for closing streets and alleys as outlined in North Carolina General Statutes, Section 160A-299, requires that Council first adopt a resolution declaring its intent to close a portion of the Alley and calling a public hearing on the question; said Statute further requires that the resolution shall be published once a week for two successive weeks prior to the hearing, and a copy thereof be sent by registered or certified mail to all owners of property adjoining a portion of the alley shown on the county tax records, and a notice of the closing and public hearing shall be prominently posted in at least two places along the Alley; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, at its regularly scheduled session of February 27, 1995, that it intends to close a portion of the Alley lying perpendicular to The Plaza and within the 1300 block of the Plaza, the portion of the Alley being more particularly described on a map and by a metes and bounds description available for inspection in the City Clerk's office, and hereby calls a public hearing on the question to be held at 7:00 p.m., on Monday, the 27th day of March, 1995, at CMGC, 600 E. Fourth Street.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish a copy of this resolution in the Mecklenburg Times once a week for two successive weeks next preceding the date fixed here for such hearing, as required by N.C.G.S. § 160A-299.

A motion was made by Councilmember Scarborough and seconded by

Councilmember Wheeler for the adoption of the following

Resolution, and upon being put to a vote was duly adopted:

WHEREAS, on the 7th Day of July, 1989, the North Carolina Department of Transportation and the City of Charlotte entered into a Municipal Agreement, which was supplemented on the 12th day of March, 1990, and the 9th day of January, 1995 for the improvement of US 74 (Independence Boulevard) from I-277 (Brookshire Freeway) to Briar Creek); in Charlotte under Project U-0209 C; and,

WHEREAS, the Department and the Municipality now wish to amend the Agreement to add a provision which stipulates that the Department, at the request of the Municipality, shall construct a brick noise wall barrier in lieu of a pile and panel noise wall for noise walls 4 and 5 (as identified on the construction plans for project U-0209 C); and,

WHEREAS, the Municipality shall reimburse the Department the actual betterment cost (estimated to be \$137,050) of brick rather than pile and panel; and,

WHEREAS, the Municipality shall not pay for said betterment costs for the brick noise walls with funds appropriated for High Occupancy Vehicles lanes, as denoted in the Agreement for Project U-209 executed July 7, 1989 and supplemented on September 26, 1994.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Project U-0209 C, Mecklenburg County, is hereby formally approved by the City Council of the Municipality of Charlotte and that the Director of Transportation and the Clerk of this Municipality are hereby empowered to sign and execute the Agreement with the Department of Transportation.


A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT




