

A RESOLUTION AMENDING A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CONDEMNATION
PROCEEDINGS FOR THE ACQUISITION OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY
FOR THE PURPOSE OF CORRECTING A TYPOGRAPHICAL ERROR


WHEREAS, by resolution, the City Council of The City of Charlotte authorized the acquisition of certain property for the Purser/Finchley Storm Drainage Project, Phase I as set out in Minute Book 107 and recorded in full in Resolution Book 33, Pages 186-187; and

WHEREAS, in the property description, the phrase "permanent sanitary sewer easement" was inadvertently used to describe an easement acquired; and

WHEREAS, the property description should read 48,852 square feet for a "permanent stormwater drainage easement".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, at its regularly assembled meeting of February 26, 1996 that the resolution adopted March 27, 1995 is hereby amended to correct the typographical error and delete the words "sanitary sewer" and replace them with the words "stormwater drainage".



"BLIZZARD OF 96"**





OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA

A motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Rousso and seconded by
Councilmember Scarborough for the adoption of the following
Resolution, and upon being put to a vote was duly adopted:

WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute 20-115.1 requires that
the City Council concur in the designation of Brookshire
Freeway/Boulevard (NC 16) between I-77 and I-85 as a twin trailer
truck route; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation has
conducted a public hearing to receive and consider comments prior to
making the designation; and

WHEREAS, opposition to the designation which was raised at the
public hearing has not been resolved to the satisfaction of the City
Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the
Municipality of Charlotte does not support the designation of
Brookshire Freeway/Boulevard (NC 16) between I-77 and I-85 as a twin
trailer truck route.
