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## RESOLUTION RELATING TO TWO-THIRDS GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND AUTHORIZATION FOR UP TO APPROXIMATELY \$20,480,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, TO INCLUDE UP TO APPROXIMATELY \$19,730,000 STREET BONDS AND \$750,000 CEMETERY BONDS

RESOLVED, by the City Council (the "City Council") of the City of Charlotte (the "Issuer") that the appropriate officers of the Issuer be, and they hereby are, authorized to proceed with a two-thirds general obligation bond authorization, issuance and sale for general obligation bonds in an estimated principal amount up to approximately \$20,480,000 to include up to approximately \$19,730,000 street bonds and \$750,000 cemetery bonds to finance certain street, sidewalk and cemetery capital projects pursuant to the Issuer's current Capital Improvement Program; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, by the City Council that it is hereby determined that said capital projects and said bonds are necessary and expedient, the amount of the proposed two-thirds general obligation bonds is adequate and not excessive to fund said capital projects, the debt management and the budgetary and fiscal management policies of the Issuer have been carried out in strict compliance with applicable law and no increase in property taxes is contemplated to pay the debt service on said bonds; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that any and all actions taken by the appropriate officers of the Issuer to submit an Application for Approval of Issuance of Two-Thirds General Obligation Bonds to the North Carolina Local Government Commission be, and they hereby are ratified, approved and confirmed, and that the Director of Finance, the Deputy Director of Finance and the City Treasurer of the Issuer be, and each of them hereby is, authorized and confirmed to serve as a representative of the Issuer and to sign and file said application; and

BE IT ORDERED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte:

1. That, pursuant to The Local Government Bond Act, as amended, the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, is hereby authorized to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Street Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$19,730,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging, extending and improving the street and road system of said City, including streets and roads constituting a part of the State highway system and including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, related studies, plans, and design, and acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, widening, extending, paving, resurfacing, grading and improving streets, roads and intersections and acquiring, constructing, reconstructing or improving sidewalks, curbs, gutters, drains, bridges, overpasses, underpasses, grade crossings and providing related landscaping, lighting, traffic controls, signals and markers, and acquiring any necessary equipment, land, interests in land and rights of-way.

2. That taxes shall be levied in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said bonds.

3. That a sworn statement of the debt of said City has been filed with the City Clerk and is open to public inspection.

4. That this order shall take effect 30 days after its publication following adoption, unless it is petitioned to a vote of the people as provided in N.C.G.S. § 159-60, and that in that event this order shall take effect when approved by the voters of said City at a referendum as provided in said Act.

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improving the cemetery system of said City, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, related studies, plans and design and the acquisition, construction, reconstruction and improvement of cemetery properties, sidewalks, paths, benches, signage, gates, fences, roads and providing related landscaping and the acquisition of any necessary equipment, land, interests in land and rights of way.

2. That taxes shall be levied in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said bonds.

 That a sworn statement of the debt of said City has been filed with the City Clerk and is open to public inspection.

4. That this order shall take effect 30 days after its publication following adoption, unless it is petitioned to a vote of the people as provided in N.C.G.S. § 159-60, and that in that event this order shall take effect when approved by the voters of said City at a referendum as provided in said Act.

2. That taxes shall be levied in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said Refunding Bonds.

#### ORDER AUTHORIZING \$16,000,000 AIRPORT GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS

WHEREAS, it is proposed that the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, contract a debt and in evidence thereof issue Airport General Obligation Refunding Bonds for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, to refund all or a portion of the City's outstanding Airport General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 1990, dated July 1, 1990; and

WHEREAS, said Airport General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 1990, provided funds, with other available funds, to refund \$21,800,000 of the City's outstanding Airport Bonds, Series 1980A, dated September 1, 1980; and

WHEREAS, said Airport Bonds, Series 1980A, financed, with other available funds, the construction of portions of the terminal complex and certain appurtenant facilities at the Charlotte/Douglas International Airport which is located at 5501 Josh Birmingham Parkway, Charlotte, North Carolina, and is owned and operated by the City;

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte:
1. That, pursuant to The Local Government Bond Act, as amended, the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, is hereby authorized to issue Airport General Obligation Refunding Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$16,000,000 for the purpose of providing funds, together with any other available funds, for refunding all or a portion of the City's
outstanding Airport General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 1990, dated July 1, 1990, and paying expenses related thereto.

2. That taxes shall be levied in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said Airport General Obligation Refunding Bonds.

3. That the application of any enterprise revenues of the Charlotte/Douglas International Airport, an enterprise including capital project(s) financed with the City's Airport Bonds, Series 1980A, to the payment of the principal of and the interest on Airport General Obligation Refunding Bonds by agreement or by operation of law is subject to any prior lien on any such revenues of the outstanding general obligation airport bonds heretofore issued by the City, any airport revenue bonds heretofore or hereafter issued under the Bond Order adopted by the City on November 18, 1985, as said Bond Order is supplemented or amended from time to time, and any airport revenue bonds hereafter issued under any other bond order or resolution adopted by the City.

4. That a sworn statement of the debt of said City has been filed with the City Clerk and is open to public inspection.

5. That this order shall take effect upon its adoption.
