ORDINANCE OF THE CHARLOTTE CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE CHARLOTTE-MECKLENBURG POLICE DEPARTMENT TO SEEK STATE ACCESS TO SBI / DCI CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION FOR USE IN THE ISSUANCE AND REVOCATION OF SEXUALLY ORIENTED BUSINESSES LICENSES

WHEREAS, Article X., "Sexually Oriented Businesses" of Chapter 6, "Businesses and Trades" of the Charlotte City Code provides for the licensing of sexually oriented businesses in the City of Charlotte; and

WHEREAS, Section 6-137(a) of the Code provides that the chief of police of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department is responsible for issuing sexually oriented business licenses; and

WHEREAS, Section 6-138(b)(7) of the Code provides for the denial of a sexually oriented business license if an applicant or any individual identified in an application has been convicted of a sexually oriented crime within certain time parameters; and

WHEREAS, Section 6-144(b)(6) of the Code provides for the revocation of a sexually oriented business license if a licensec, owner, or operator of a business has been convicted of a sexually oriented crime after the issuance of the license; and

WHEREAS, Section 6-135 of the Code defines a sexually oriented crime as any offense under local, state, or federal law involving or related to rape, sex offense, sexual abuse of minors, crime against nature, incest, prostitution, indecent exposure, or a violation of the sexually oriented business ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the term "sexual abuse of minors," as set forth above, includes the following offenses under the North Carolina General Statutes: 14-190.16, 14-190.17, 14-190.17A, 14-190.18, 14-190.19, 14-190.20, 14-202.1, 14-202.3, 14-316.1, 14-318.2, and 14-318.4; and

WHEREAS, in order to determine whether an applicant or an individual identified in an application for a sexually oriented business license or a licensee, owner, or operator of a sexually oriented business has been convicted of a sexually oriented crime, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department desires State access to the SBI / DCI Criminal History Record Information to obtain criminal history information on all such persons; and

WHEREAS, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department will obtain said criminal history information on each such person based on the identification information regarding that person contained in the application for the sexually oriented business license; and

WHEREAS, if said criminal history information reveals that any such person has been convicted of a sexually oriented crime, as prescribed by Sections 6-138(b)(6) and 6-144(b)(7) of the ordinance, the chief of police of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department will deny or revoke the sexually oriented business license in question;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte that the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department is hereby authorized to seek State access to the SBI / DCI Criminal History Record Information to obtain criminal history information on an applicant or an individual identified in an application for a sexually oriented business license or a licensee, owner, or operator of a sexually oriented business.

WHEREAS, the City Council has authority to amend the Zoning Ordinance by Chapter 6: Part 1 and a public hearing was held on July 19, 1999; and

WHEREAS, in the passage of this ordinance the City Council of the City of Charlotte has considered the promotion of the health, safety, general welfare, and public interest of the community, and the requirements in Section 6.204.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE:

<u>Section 1.</u> That Section 1.104 of the City of Charlotte Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended by changing from R-4 to R-8MF(CD) on the Official Zoning Map, City of Charlotte, North Carolina the following described property:



PARALLEL CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT

This is a parallel conditional use permit approved by the Charlotte City Council to Westfield Homes of North Carolina, Inc. and successors-in-interest of the property described as tax parcels 04-151-01 through 05 and described in detail further in the ordinance, identified below, approved by the City Council.

In approving this parallel conditional use permit, the Charlotte City Council amended Chapter 6: Part 2 of the City of Charlotte Zoning Ordinance and the official zoning map. The property now has a parallel conditional use district zoning classification of R-8MF(CD) on the official zoning map.

This parallel conditional use permit is subject to and incorporates by reference all of the following: the schematic plan, the supporting text, all attached conditions, and Chapter 6: Part 1 and 2 of the City of Charlotte Zoning Ordinance, all of which preceding are binding upon the property and all subsequent development and use of the property. A failure to comply with any of the above may result in revocation of the parallel conditional use permit in accordance with the authority of the City Council under Chapter 6: Part 1 of the City of Charlotte Zoning Ordinance.

Three years from the date of approval of this parallel conditional use permit, the Planning Commission shall determine if active efforts to develop in accordance with approved plans have occurred. If active efforts to develop have not occurred, then a report shall be forwarded to the City Council which may recommend that action be initiated to remove the parallel conditional use district in accordance with Chapter 6: Part 1.
