

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NUMBER 1835-X, THE 2001-2002 BUDGET ORDINANCE,
PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION FOR MCALPINE NUTRIENT REMOVAL

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Charlotte;

- Section 1. That the sum of \$620,000 is hereby estimated to be available from Revenue Bonds.
- Section 2. That the sum of \$620,000 is hereby appropriated to the McApline Nutrient Removal project (631.31) in the Water and Sewer Capital Project Fund (2071).
- Section 3. That the existence of the project may extend beyond the end of the fiscal year. Therefore, this ordinance will remain in effect for the duration of the project and funds are to be carried forward to subsequent fiscal years until all funds are expended or the project is officially closed.
- Section 4. All ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- Section 5. This ordinance shall be effective upon adoption.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NUMBER 1835-X, THE 2001-2002 BUDGET ORDINANCE, APPROPRIATING CITY COUNCIL CONTINGENCY FUNDS FOR THE MINORITY AND WOMEN'S BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT DISPARITY STUDY PROCESS.

Section 1. That the sum of \$190,930 is hereby available from the General Fund Council Contingency.

ORDINANCE NO. 2016

AMENDING CHAPTER 14

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14 OF THE CHARLOTTE CITY CODE ENTITLED "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" TO PROVIDE A CHILD HELMET PROTECTION REGULATION.

Section 1. Chapter 14 of the Charlotte City Code is hereby amended by adding a new Subsection 14-108 to read as follows:

Section 14-108 Child Protection Helmet.

- (A) No person under the age of sixteen (16) shall use, operate or be a passenger on a bicycle, in-line skates, roller skates, skateboard or scooter on a public roadway, public bicycle path, or other public right-of-way unless the person wears a protective helmet of good fit, fastened securely upon the head with straps of the helmet.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for a parent or guardian to knowingly allow his or her child or ward to so operate or ride a bicycle, in-line skates, roller skates, skateboard or scooter without wearing a protective helmet of good fit, fastened securely upon the head with straps of the helmet.
- (C) Such helmet shall meet or exceed the safety standards set forth by the U. S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, the American National Standards Institute, or the Snell Memorial Foundation.
- (D) Penalties - Violations of Section 14-108 shall be punishable by a civil fine of \$25.00. The fine may be waived as to any first time violator upon presentation of evidence that the violator has purchased or procured an approved helmet and demonstrates intention of using the helmet as required by law.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall become effective one hundred and twenty days (120) from the date of its adoption.

AMENDED CHAPTER 14
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14 OF THE CHARTER OF THE
CITY OF CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA, TO PROVIDE FOR
CHILD SAFETY PROTECTION REGULATIONS

Section 14-108 of the Charter of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina, is amended to read as follows:

- (A) No person under the age of sixteen (16) shall use, possess or be in possession of a firearm in a public place unless such person is licensed as a public trustee, public trustee candidate or other person licensed under the public trustee profession act or good faith security from the sale and use of firearms.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for a parent or guardian to knowingly allow his or her child or ward to be present in a public place, to use, possess or be in possession of a firearm without a license or other good faith security from the sale and use of firearms.
- (C) Any person who is found in violation of either clause (A) or (B) of this section shall be fined not more than one hundred dollars (\$100) or imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both such fine and imprisonment.
