AN ORDINANCE TO EXTEND THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA

WHEREAS, the City Council has been petitioned under G.S. 160A-31 to annex the area described below; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has certified the sufficiency of the petition and a public hearing on the question of this annexation was held in the Meeting Chamber of the Charlotte Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 E. Fourth Street, Charlotte, N.C. at 7:00 p.m. on June 24, 2002 after due notice by The Charlotte Observer on June 10, 2002; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the petition meets the requirements of G.S. 160A-31;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina that:

Section 1. By virtue of the authority granted by G.S. 160A-31, the following described territory is hereby annexed and made part of the City of Charlotte as of June 24, 2002.

Such a map shall also be delivered to the County Board of Elections, as required by G.S. 163-288.1.




