SERVICEBERRY

AMELANCHIER CANADENSIS

Serviceberry is a multi-stemmed understory tree. It can grow in full sun, but here in Charlotte would do well with afternoon shade. With the early flowers, summer berries and beautiful red-orange foliage, it has great three-season interest.



TYPE:

Deciduous



SIZE:

30 feet high
20 feet wide



SUN:

Full sun to part shade



FLOWERS:

White flowers in drooping clusters which appear before the leaves emerge



USDA ZONES:

4-8



ID TIPS:

1- to 3-inch-long, finely toothed, elliptic leaves



WILDLIFE VALUE:

Robins, cedar waxwings, rose-breasted grosbeaks, and other birds and mammals consume fruit.



INTERESTING FACT:

Edible berries are used in jams, jellies and pies.
