



PINUS ECHINATA

A medium-sized, hardy pine. Dark bluish-green needles appear in bundles of two. Brown cones 1.5 to 2.5" long are usually not produced until the tree reaches 20 years old. Attractive reddishbrown bark is scaly plates on mature trees.

FLOWERS:

In clusters at twig tips; male flowers red-purple catkins; female flowers pale red strobilus USDA ZONES: 6-9

ID TIPS:

Very small resin or "pitch" pockets may be seen on the trunk.

WILDLIFE VALUE: Host for the elfin butterfly
