# LIQUIDAMBAR STYRACIFLUA

The five-lobed, star-shaped leaves are a distinguishing feature of this tree. The dark gray bark of mature trees has diamond-shaped furrows. The leaves change to red, yellow or purple in the fall. Sweetgums are one of the first trees to establish in disturbed areas in Charlotte.



#### TYPE:

Deciduous



# SIZE:

80 feet high 60 feet wide



#### SUN:

Full sun



# **FLOWERS:**

Insignificant; male and female flowers on same trees



#### **USDA ZONES:**

5-9



#### ID TIPS:

Five-lobed, star-shaped glossy green leaves. The spiny burr-like seed balls (called gum balls) are from female flowers.



# WILDLIFE VALUE:

Seeds are eaten by squirrels, chipmunks and a variety of birds (eastern goldfinches, sparrows, mourning doves, northern bobwhite quail and wild turkey).



# **INTERESTING FACT:**

Leaves have a lemony scent when crushed.
