A look at 2017 crash data



73 crashes occur per day on our streets. That's more than **26,000 crashes** per year.




71 crashes resulted in **74 fatalities** on our streets in 2017. This is the 3rd consecutive increase in annual fatalities.




27 pedestrians and 4 bicyclist were killed on our streets.

In 2017, people walking and bicycling were involved in less than 3% of all crashes but accounted for 44% of all traffic deaths





Crashes by Mode





People Killed by Mode













What types of crashes are occurring on our streets?

- High Injury Network
 - A network of streets that have a higher incidence of severe and fatal collisions




Where are fatal and serious injury crashes occurring?


- Communities of Concern
 - Highlight areas of our community that may be experiencing or are identified as at risk for injury inequities







Contributing Circumstances (731 KSI 2013-2017)



Speeding

153 crashes on Charlotte streets involved speeding



Inattention

63 crashes involved drivers who were distracted while operating the vehicle



Impairment

45 crashes involved drivers who were impaired while operating their vehicle



Failed to yield

71 crashes involved drivers who failed to yield the ROW
