





Fatal and Serious Injury Crashes (FY 2021 to FY 2025)




Total Crashes (FY 2021 to FY 2025)

Most Common Contributing Factors for Serious Injury and Fatal Crashes Graph (FY 2021 to FY 2025)


Most Common Contributing Factors for Fatal and Serious Injury Crashes (FY 2021 to FY 2025)





Traffic Crash Fatality and Serious Injury by Race and Ethnicity (FY 2025)




Traffic Crash Fatality and Serious Injury by Gender (FY 2025)





FY 2026 Priorities

Vision Zero Action Plan Update

In collaboration with CRTPO, CDOT will continue participating in a regional comprehensive safety action planning process to update the Action Plan. The update will include participation from the Vision Zero Task Force, ensure alignment with the SMP, and incorporate the Safe Systems Approach more effectively in its benchmarks.

High Injury Network Deep Dive Analysis

With increased funding from the 2024 transportation bonds, CDOT will analyze the crash data underlying all High Injury Networks produced to date, identifying street segments and intersections that have the highest incidents of serious and fatal crashes. Potential countermeasures for these street segments will be developed in the coming year.

Deliver First SS4A Funded Projects

In partnership with the Department of General Services, CDOT will deliver the first phase of Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) projects. In 2023, the city was awarded a \$4.4 million federal grant from the Federal Highway Administration through the SS4A program. Several projects have completed design and will go to construction in the coming months.

Continue to Explore Automated Enforcement Policy

In July 2025, the North Carolina General Assembly passed Senate Bill 391, which enables municipalities and counties to install speed cameras in school zones. CDOT will continue to explore potential approaches to automated enforcement.




