

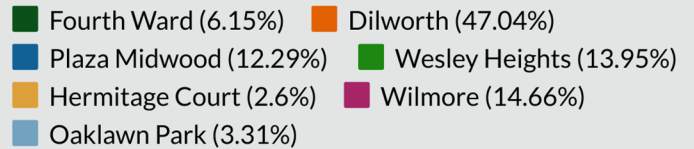
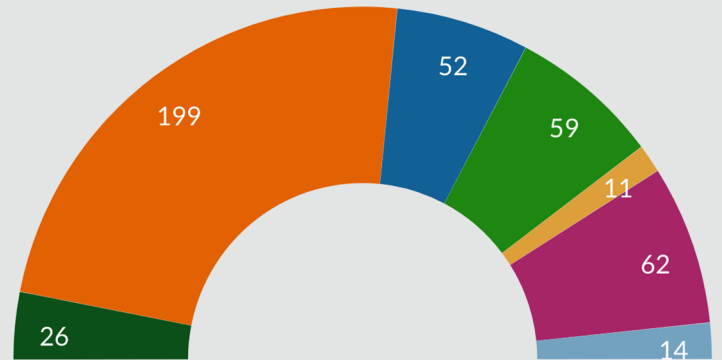
# CHARLOTTE HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION

### 2021 HIGHLIGHTS

- Adopted **new Design Standards** for multi-family + non-residential buildings after extensive public outreach

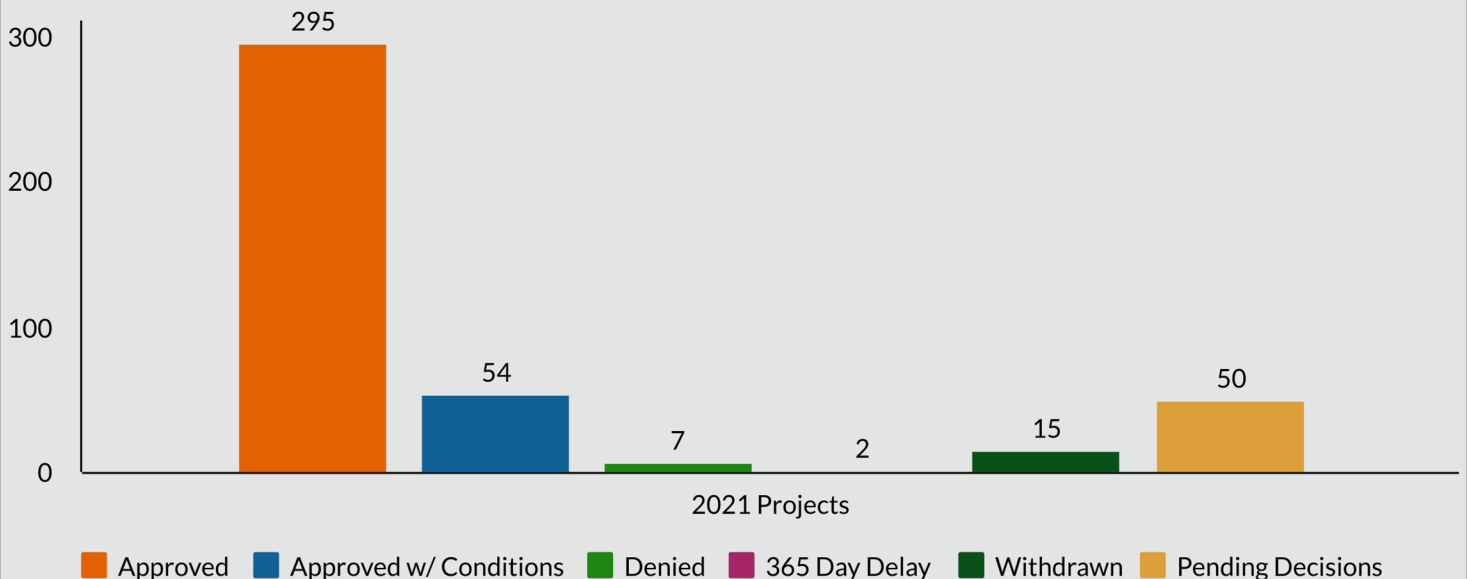

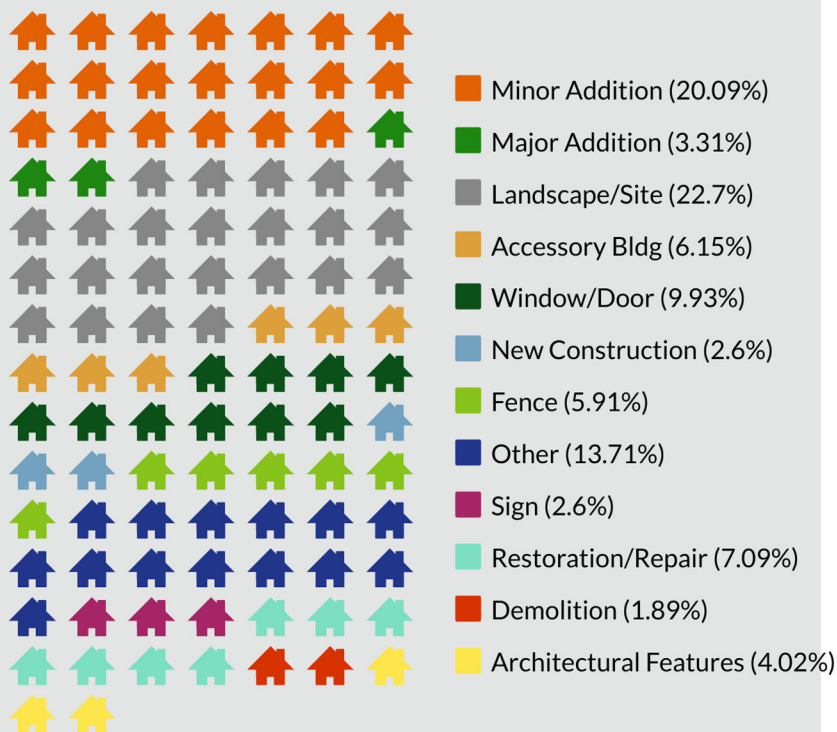

In addition, the HDC and its staff provide historic preservation education and technical advice for other local government agencies and the community at large.
