## General Review Information

The petition is located on the east side of Carmel Road, a City-maintained minor throughfare north of Moreland Farms Road, a City-maintained local street. The petition is located in a south wedge outside of Route 4.

Active Projects Near the Site:

• Carmel Road minor gap project

CDOT's review of this rezoning petition is intended to provide consistency with council adopted policies, plans, standards and guidelines including, but not limited to, the <u>Transportation Action Plan (TAP)</u>, <u>Vision</u> <u>Zero</u>, <u>Urban Street Design Guidelines (USDG)</u>, <u>Center</u>, <u>Corridor and Wedges</u>, <u>Charlotte BIKES</u>, <u>Traffic</u> <u>Impact Study Guidelines</u> and <u>Charlotte WALKS</u>. With a commitment to design complete streets, this review is to ensure that the City's transportation network supports current and future land uses and includes streets that provide safe and comfortable mobility for motorists, pedestrians, bicyclists, and transit users.

This document is primarily for communication to Planning Department staff as part of the overall City staff analysis of the rezoning petition and includes an overall summary of the case from a transportation perspective, information on trip generation, and resolved or outstanding site plan concerns. Additional advisory information about the driveway permit process is provided for information only.

Based on our review of the petition, we offer the following information for your consideration.

## **Transportation Summary**

The petition is located on the east side of Carmel Road, a City-maintained minor throughfare north of Moreland Farms Road, a City-maintained local street. Additional land use density information is needed to determine if a Traffic Impact Study (TIS) is required or not for this site. Site plan and/or conditional note revisions are needed to commit to meeting the Chapter 20 ordinance for plating strip and sidewalk, commit to restricting Colony Road access to right-in / right-out, and construct a buffered bicycle facility. Further details are listed below.

# Outstanding Issues

## Strikethrough = Resolved

- 1. Curbline:
  - a. **Carmel Road:** Location of curb and gutter to be moved to 27 feet from roadway centerline to accommodate the Charlotte Streets Map with a roadway typical section of CLDSM 11.09 Minor Thoroughfare.
  - b. **Colony Road:** Location of curb and gutter to be moved to 24 feet from roadway centerline to accommodate the Charlotte Streets Map with a roadway typical section of CLDSM 11.09 Minor Thoroughfare

NOTE: Additional distance from center line to back of curb may be required in locations where a median is present or around intersections and interchanges.

Label and dimension the curb and gutter from the centerline for each road on the site plan.

## 2. Traffic Study:

Further information is needed to determine if a Traffic Study is needed for this site.

- 3. Revise site plan and conditional note(s) to commit to dedicate 43 feet of right-of-way from the Carmel road centerline and 40 feet of right of way form the Colony Road centerline. The site plan shall label and dimension the right-of-way from the road centerline.
- 4. Per Chapter 20 revise site plan and conditional note(s) to commit to construct an 8-foot planting strip, and 6-foot sidewalk on Carmel Road or if the proposed dwelling units exceeds 12 per acre after verifying density, revise site plan and conditional note(s) to commit to construct an 8-foot planting strip, and 8-foot sidewalk along Carmel road. The wider sidewalk also meets the Charlotte WALKS Policy.

Reference (CLDSM standard detail U-04.16) for street typical.

- 5. Revise site plan and conditional note(s) to commit to construct a buffered bicycle facility by locating the back of curb and gutter 27' from the center line to meet the Council-adopted Charlotte BIKES Policy.
- 6. Add a conditional note specifying "A Right-of-Way Encroachment Agreement is required for the installation of any non-standard item(s) (irrigation systems, decorative concrete pavement, brick pavers, etc.) within a proposed/existing City-maintained street right-of-way by a private individual, group, business, or homeowner's/business association. An encroachment agreement must be approved by CDOT prior to construction/installation. Contact CDOT for additional information concerning cost, submittal, and liability insurance coverage requirements."

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- 7. Revise site plan and conditional note(s) to commit to restricting access off Colony Road to right-in / right-out.
- 8. Add a conditional note specifying "the Petitioner shall dedicate and convey in fee simple all rights-ofway to the City before the site's first building certificate of occupancy is issued. CDOT requests rightsof-way set at 2' behind back of sidewalk where feasible."
- 9. Add a conditional note specifying "All transportation improvements will be approved and constructed before the site's first building certificate of occupancy is issued. The petitioner may phase transportation improvements if said improvements and phasing are explicitly described in site plan notes."

# Advisory Information

The following are requirements of the developer that must be satisfied prior to driveway permit approval. These requirements shall be reflected on the rezoning plan, as appropriate.

- 1. CDOT has the authority to regulate/approve all private street/driveway and public street connections to the right-of-way of a street under the regulatory jurisdiction of the City of Charlotte, per the City of Charlotte's Driveway Regulations.
- 2. Adequate sight triangles must be reserved at the existing/proposed street entrance(s). Two 35' x 35' sight triangles (and two 10' x 70' sight triangles on NCDOT-maintained streets) are required for the entrance(s) to meet requirements. All proposed trees, berms, walls, fences, and/or identification signs shall not interfere with sight distance at the entrance(s) and shall be identified on the site plan.
- 3. The proposed driveway connection(s) to public streets will require a driveway permit(s) to be submitted to CDOT (and NCDOT on NCDOT-maintained streets) for review and approval. The exact driveway location(s) and type/width of the driveway(s) will be determined by CDOT during the driveway permit process. The locations of the driveway(s) shown on the site plan are subject to change in order to align with driveway(s) on the opposite side of the street and comply with City Driveway Regulations and the City Tree Ordinance.
- 4. All proposed commercial driveway connections to a future public street will require a driveway permit submitted to CDOT for review and approval.
- 5. Any fence or wall constructed along or adjacent to any sidewalk or street right-of-way requires a certificate issued by CDOT.
