Little Hope Creek Wastewater Improvement Project

WHAT: Contractors for Charlotte Water, led by Park Construction, will continue making intermediate wastewater pipe repairs as part of the Little Hope Creek Wastewater Improvement Project. These point repairs will be in the streets and public rights-of-way – not on private property. This work includes crews installing a sock-like lining inside existing pipe through manholes, as well as open cutting and replacing existing pipe segments and rehabilitating manholes.

WHEN: Crews are expected to begin in early April 2021.

WHERE: Crews will work at various areas in the Collingwood, Ashbrook/Clawson Village and Madison Park neighborhoods (*see map*).

WHAT TO EXPECT:

Impacts to driveway access – While crews will not be on private property, the work in the streets and public rights-of-way may cause some impacts to driveway access. Some residents may receive a door hanger with additional instructions for parking, if necessary. Crews will also work directly with property owners to navigate around the work.

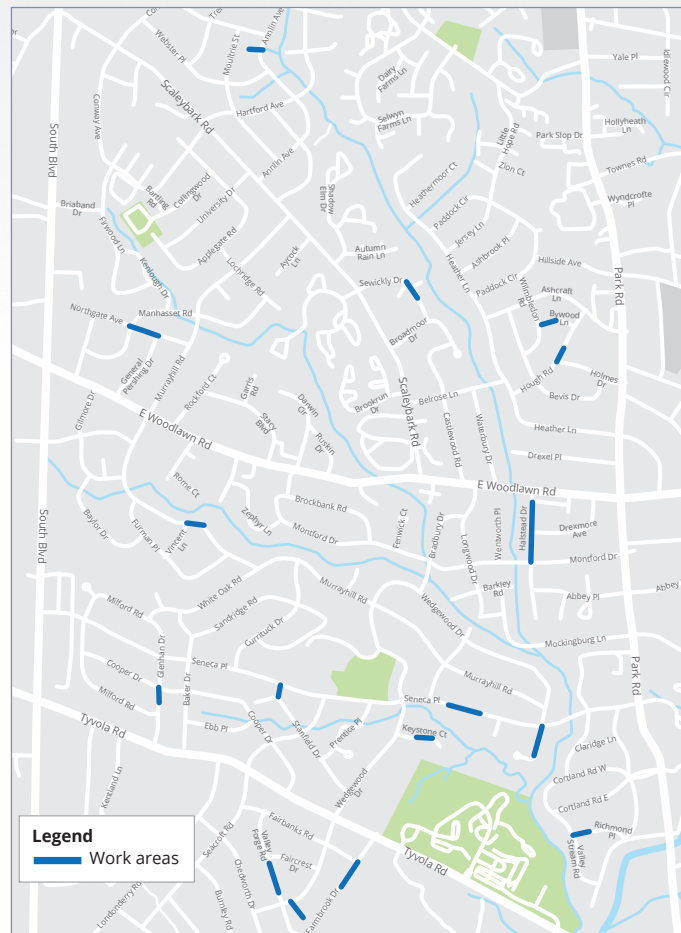
Lane/road closures and detours around work area – Road, lane and sidewalk closures will be in place during the work, which typically ranges from 2-3 days to complete. Motorists and pedestrians should follow all traffic control signs to safely navigate around the work.

Odors – You may notice some odors outside during the work. If you smell an odor in your home, please pour a gallon of water into floor drains, toilets and sinks.

Loud machinery – To make the point repairs, crews will cut and replace the existing pipe. This work can be loud as it requires heavy machinery.

Continuation of service – Crews will bypass pump to a temporary pipeline to keep the line in service during the repairs.

Construction traffic – Small to mid-size machinery will be in the streets near the work areas.



NEXT STEPS: The work to complete all point repairs is expected to take three to four weeks to complete. Each point repair takes two to three days to complete. Construction schedules are subject to change due to weather and other conditions.
