

CHARLOTTE FIRE DEPARTMENT ISO Class 1

In 2015, the Charlotte Fire Department earned the highest recognition possible in the field when it received a Class 1 Public Protection Classification (PPC) rating from the Insurance Services Office.

The Insurance Services Office (ISO) rates 48,574 fire protection areas in the U.S.

Just 132 received the Class 1 rating.

This means the Charlotte Fire Department ranks in the top two-tenths of one percent of all fire departments in America.

What does the Class 1 rating mean for Charlotte?

- It means residents, business owners and visitors to Charlotte can count on **superior fire protection**.
- A Class 1 rating demonstrates:
 - Quick response to community needs
 - Risk mitigation at the highest possible standard
 - A stellar commitment to preserve life & property

Will the Class 1 rating impact my wallet?

It could. The Class 1 PPO rating is **one of the factors** used to determine fire insurance premiums for homeowners and businesses.


Fire insurance premiums are based on the quality of service and fire protection available. The top rating means Charlotte property owners can get the **lowest premium possible** on that area of insurance.

According to the Insurance Services Office, "A community's investment in fire mitigation is a proven and reliable predicator of future fire losses. Insurance companies use PPC information to help establish fair premiums for fire insurance - generally offering lower premiums in communities with better protection."
