Project Manager Matthew Anderson introduced the project team and provided a general overview of the program.

Any stream improvements or stabilization efforts for eroded areas, if necessary, will need to comply with federal and state agency requirements which seek to avoid and minimize any such work.

Will Wilhelm, engineering consultant with Kimley Horn, explained how public input and involvement had been compiled to compare drainage system and flooding models in the project area. Various areas of concern were highlighted.

Trees have fallen into the channels blocking the creek. What can be done?

Staff discussed the next steps including analyzing several alternatives to help alleviate current conditions. A recommended solution will be presented at the next public meeting.
